LA VISTA CITY COUNCIL MEETING June 21, 2011

A meeting of the City Council of the City of La Vista, Nebraska was convened in open and public session at 7:00 p.m. on June 21, 2011. Present were Councilmembers: Sell, Ronan, Quick, Sheehan, Carlisle, Crawford, Ellerbeck and Gowan. Absent: None. REPORTS FROM CITY ADMINISTRATOR AND DEPARTMENT HEADS

City Administrator Gunn reminded Councilmembers of upcoming budget workshops on July 11th and July 12th at 6 p.m.

City Clerk Buethe reported that fireworks stands would be inspected on the 23rd and open on the 25th of June.

Public Works Director Soucie informed the council that on September 9th and 10th from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. tires will be collected at the Public Works Facility, and on November 12th from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. a leaf collection site will be at the Public Works Facility. Soucie also reported on issues at the pool and that they believe the baby pool will reopen this weekend.

Public Buildings and Grounds Director Archibald reported that the flags were not being flown at City Hall due to a broken cable inside the pole, but it would be fixed in the next week.

Library Director Barcal reported on Reading Programs at the Library.

B. RESOLUTION – RIGHT OF WAY DEDICATION – EASTPORT PARKWAY

Councilmember Gowan introduced and moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 11-072; A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, NEBRASKA RECOMMENDING APPROVAL OF THE PLAT AND DEDICATION FOR STREET WIDENING FOR EASTPORT PARKWAY, LOCATED IN PART OF THE EAST ½ OF SECTION 18, T14N, R12E OF THE 6TH P.M., SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA AS IDENTIFIED IN THE ATTACHED EXHIBIT.

WHEREAS, the City Council approved the plat for Southport East which created Lot 16 and the adjacent right-of-way; and

WHEREAS, subsequently, as part of the Corps of Engineers permitting process for the construction of Eastport Parkway, the relocation of the road was required; and

WHEREAS, the additional right-of-way dedication for the relocated road was not completed by the property owner; and

WHEREAS, the City Council recommends approval of the plat and dedication document as attached for Eastport Parkway, located in part of the East ½ of Section 18, T14N, R12E of the 6th P.M., Sarpy County, Nebraska as identified in the attached Exhibit; and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer and Public Works Director recommend approval of the dedication.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and City Council of the City of La Vista, Nebraska, do hereby dedicate to the public for public use the street as shown on the attached Exhibit to be hereafter known as Eastport Parkway and authorize the Mayor to sign the dedication.

Seconded by Councilmember Carlisle. Councilmembers voting aye: Sell, Ronan, Quick, Sheehan, Carlisle, Crawford, Ellerbeck, and Gowan. Nays: None. Abstain: None. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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C. CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT AMENDMENT – AUTOMOBILE DISPLAY, SALES, SERVICE AND REPAIR, LOT 16 SOUTHPORT EAST

1. PUBLIC HEARING

At 7:11 p.m. Mayor Kindig opened the public hearing and stated the floor was now open for discussion on the Conditional Use Permit Amendment- Automobile Display, Sales, Service and Repair, Lot 16 Southport East. Councilmember Carlisle motioned to continue the Public Hearing to the July 5th, 2011 meeting. Seconded by Councilmember Sell. Councilmembers voting aye: Sell, Ronan, Quick, Sheehan, Carlisle, Crawford, Ellerbeck, and Gowan. Nays: None. Abstain: None. Absent: None. Motion carried.

D. STREET NAMING – JAMES AVENUE – EAST OF 69TH STREET TO EAST LINE OF LOT 148

1. PUBLIC HEARING

At 7:12 p.m. Mayor Kindig opened the public hearing and stated the floor was now open for discussion on Street Naming of James Avenue, East of 69th Street to East of Line of Lot 148. Anyone desiring to comment was asked to keep their comments to three minutes.

At 7:13 p.m. Councilmember Ellerbeck made a motion to close the public hearing. Seconded by Councilmember Crawford. Councilmembers voting aye: Sell, Ronan, Quick, Sheehan, Carlisle, Crawford, Ellerbeck, and Gowan. Nays: None. Abstain: None. Absent: None. Motion carried.

2. ORDINANCE

Councilmember Gowan introduced and moved for adoption of Ordinance 1151 entitled: AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, NEBRASKA TO NAME AN UNNAMED STREET TO JAMES AVENUE; AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE.

Councilmember Sheehan moved that the statutory rule requiring reading on three different days be suspended. Councilmember Ellerbeck seconded the motion to suspend the rules and upon roll call vote on the motion the following. Councilmembers voting aye: Sell, Ronan, Quick, Sheehan, Carlisle, Crawford, Ellerbeck and Gowan. Nays: None. Abstain: None. Absent: None. The motion to suspend the rules was adopted and the statutory rule was declared suspended for consideration of said ordinance.

Said ordinance was then read by title and thereafter Councilmember Sheehan moved for final passage of the ordinance which motion was seconded by Councilmember Carlisle. The Mayor then stated the question, "Shall Ordinance No. 1151 be passed and adopted?" Upon roll call vote the following Councilmember voted aye: Sell, Ronan, Quick, Sheehan, Carlisle, Crawford, Ellerbeck, and Gowan. The following voted nay: None. The following were absent: None. The passage and adoption of said ordinance having been concurred on by a majority of all members of the Council, the Mayor declared the ordinance adopted and the Mayor, in the presence of the Council, signed and approved the ordinance and the City Clerk attested the passage/approval of the same and affixed her signature thereto.

E. RESOLUTION- JAMES AVENUE – EAST OF 69TH STREET – NO PARKING DESIGNATION

Councilmember Carlisle introduced and moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 11-073; A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, NEBRASKA ESTABLISHING A NO PARKING ZONE ON THE NORTH SIDE OF JAMES AVENUE FROM THE EAST LINE OF 69TH STREET EASTERLY FOR A DISTANCE OF 165 FEET.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council have determined that a "No Parking Zone" is necessary to preserve access to a property upon construction of the Keystone Trail-La Vista Link; and

WHEREAS, City Engineer and staff have reviewed the plan and recommend approval,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the "No Parking Zone" on the North side of James Avenue from the East line of 69th Street Easterly for a distance of 165 feet is approved,

BE IF FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Public Works Department be, and hereby is, authorized to install the appropriate signage designating this "No Parking Zone".

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Seconded by Councilmember Gowan. Councilmembers voting aye: Sell, Ronan, Quick, Sheehan, Carlisle, Crawford, Ellerbeck, and Gowan. Nays: None. Abstain: None. Absent: None. Motion carried.

F. RESOLUTION – GILES CORNER SUBDIVISION – NO PARKING ZONE DESIGNATIONS

Councilmember Crawford introduced and moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 11-074; A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, NEBRASKA ESTABLISHING A NO PARKING ZONE VARIOUS SIDES OF THE STREETS WITHIN THE GILES CORNER SUBDIVISION AS RECOMMENDED

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council have determined that "No Parking Zones" on various sides of the streets within the Giles Corner subdivision is necessary for safe passage of vehicles and pedestrians on the streets; and

WHEREAS, City Engineer has reviewed the plan and recommends approval,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the "No Parking Zone" on the following locations is approved:

1. A No Parking Zone on the west side of South 73rd Avenue from the north line of Outlot "C" in Giles Corner to the centerline of Braun Street.
2. A No Parking Zone on the south side of Braun Street from the centerline of Michelle Avenue to the east line of Lot 63, Giles Corner.
3. A No Parking Zone on the west side of South 72nd Avenue from the east line of Lot 63, Giles Corner to the centerline of Peters Street.
4. A No Parking Zone on the south side of Michelle Avenue from the centerline of 72nd Street to the west line of Outlot "E" in Giles Corner.
5. A No Parking Zone on the north side of Michelle Avenue from the centerline of Braun Street to the west line of Outlot "D" in Giles Corner.
6. A No Parking Zone on the north side of Michelle Avenue from the centerline of 72nd Street to the centerline of South 72nd Avenue.
7. A No Parking Zone on the east side of South 75th Avenue from the centerline of Giles Road to the centerline of Michelle Avenue.
8. A No Parking Zone on the west side of South 75th Avenue from the centerline of Giles Road to the north line of Lot 2, Giles Corner.
9. A No Parking Zone on the south side of Peters Street from the centerline of South 75th Avenue to the centerline of South 72nd Avenue.
10. A No Parking Zone on the south side of Meadow Lane from the centerline of South 75th Avenue to the centerline of South 74th Street.
11. A No Parking Zone on the east side of South 74th Street from the centerline of Giles Road to the centerline of Peters Street.
12. A No Parking Zone of the west side of South 74th Street from the centerline of Giles Road to the north line of Lot 21, Giles Corner.
13. A No Parking Zone of a portion of the South 74th Avenue Circle cul-de-sac from the south line of Lot 16 around the cul-de-sac to the south line of Lot 22.
14. A No Parking Zone of a portion of the South 73rd Avenue Circle cul-de-sac from the south line of Lot 83 around the cul-de-sac to the north line of Lot 87.
15. A No Parking Zone of a portion of the South 72nd Avenue Circle cul-de-sac from the south line of Lot 91 around the cul-de-sac to the north line of Lot 94.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Public Works Department be, and hereby is, authorized to install the appropriate signage designating these "No Parking Zones".

Seconded by Councilmember Quick. Councilmember Sheehan inquired as to the placement of the signs on the side of the street with mailboxes. City Engineer/Assistant Public Works Director Kottmann stated that they look at where the fire hydrants are, site distance, and snow plow areas. Public Works Director Soucie stated that he believes the mailboxes are cluster boxes and the number one priority when they look at placement is access to fire hydrants. Councilmember Carlisle asked about the no parking in 74th St. Ave. Cir. And 72nd Ave. Cir. Kottmann stated that the no parking in cul de sacs is placed based on the ability to keep part open for snow removal.

G. RESOLUTION – AWARD CONTRACT – LANDSCAPING IMPROVEMENTS – VAL VERDE PARK

Councilmember Sell introduced and moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 11-075; A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, NEBRASKA, ACCEPTING THE PROPOSAL SUBMITTED BY MULHALL'S, OMAHA NEBRASKA FOR LANDSCAPING IMPROVEMENTS TO VAL VERDE PARK IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$10,009.00.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of La Vista has determined that landscaping improvements to Val Verde Park is necessary; and

WHEREAS, the FY 10/11 General Fund Budget contains funding for this project; and

WHEREAS, the City of La Vista has received two grants that will cover the entire project; and

WHEREAS Subsection (C) (9) of Section 31.23 of the La Vista Municipal Code requires that the City Administrator secures Council approval prior to authorizing any purchase over \$5,000.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and City Council of La Vista, Nebraska accept the proposal submitted by Mulhall's, Omaha Nebraska for landscaping improvements to Val Verde Park in an amount not to exceed \$10,009.00.

Seconded by Councilmember Carlisle. Councilmembers voting aye: Sell, Ronan, Quick, Sheehan, Carlisle, Crawford, Ellerbeck, and Gowan. Nays: None. Abstain: None. Absent: None. Motion carried.

H. RESOLUTION – APPROVE AGREEMENT FOR SERVICES - REDISTRICTING

Councilmember Carlisle introduced and moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 11-076; A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, NEBRASKA APPROVING AN AGREEMENT FOR SERVICES WITH THE METROPOLITAN AREA PLANNING AGENCY (MAPA) FOR DEVELOPMENT AND ANALYSIS OF CITY COUNCIL ELECTION DISTRICTS (WARDS) IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$1,200.00.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council have determined that it is necessary to look at the existing ward boundaries following the 2010 U.S. Census to determining if new boundaries need to be establishes; and

WHEREAS, MAPA has prepared an Agreement with the City to analysis and develop possible new election district boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the Attachment A to the agreement outlines the scope of work that will be done by MAPA; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and City Council of the City of La Vista, Nebraska, hereby authorize the Mayor to an Agreement for Services with the Metropolitan Area Planning Agency (MAPA) for development and analysis of City Council Election Districts (Wards) in an amount not to exceed \$1,200.00.

Seconded by Councilmember Sell. Councilmembers voting aye: Sell, Ronan, Quick, Sheehan, Carlisle, Crawford, Ellerbeck, and Gowan. Nays: None. Abstain: None. Absent: None. Motion carried.
