Corridor 84 Streetscape Plan

As the transformation of 84th Street is underway, the City's vision plan is becoming a reality in Corridor 84, the plan in action.

The current focus is on a public process to create a streetscape plan for the corridor, which will include design elements such as benches, landscaping, signage and wayfinding and lighting.

The Corridor 84 Streetscape Plan is an important component of the overall vision for 84th Street because it will assist in the authentic expression of La Vista's identity while creating a sense of place for one of city's main north/south corridors.

The design process will take place over the next four months, during which time there will be opportunities for the public to review design concepts and provide feedback.

The first public meeting, held on Nov. 14, summarized the existing conditions of the project area and presented some initial concepts for the corridor and bridge-like feature at Civic Center Park.

The second public meeting is scheduled for **Wednesday, January 17, at 6**



p.m. at City Hall (8116 Park View Blvd.)

This meeting will present a preferred design for the project area, using feedback from the first public meeting. This will be an opportunity to provide input and feedback prior to the preparation of detailed construction plans.

Fiscal Year 2018 marks the second year of the City's biennial, two year, budgeting process. Here's how it works...

THE GENERAL FUND




The General Fund is the City's main operating fund, which includes the majority of the day-to-day services and programs that keep La Vista running. The primary revenue source for the General Fund is property tax; however, sales tax receipts continues to grow and make up a significant share of revenue. The budgeted expenditures for FY18 are \$17,633,989, which includes \$954,742 in capital outlay items, such as police cruisers, dump trucks and mowers.





STRONG FINANCIAL POSITION

BOND RATING **Aa3**

The City's overall financial condition is expected to remain strong in FY18. The City's bond rating is Aa3, which is of high quality and very low credit risk.

PROPERTY TAX LEVY RATE

The City's property tax levy rate is \$0.55 per \$100 of assessed valuation. This rate has been maintained for the past 7 years.

Of that \$0.55:

\$0.41 goes to the General Fund

\$0.14 goes to the Debt Service Fund


TAX VALUE ILLUSTRATION

To determine your City tax liability for City services, multiply your assessed valuation by the tax rate, then divide by 100. For example, if your home is valued at \$150,000...

$$\$150,000 \times .55/100 = \$825$$

Your property tax would be \$825 a year (or \$68.75 per month).

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM



Public Works Staff Competes in National Competition

Randy Seffron from the Streets Division of Public Works competed recently in the National Equipment Roadeo in Orlando, Florida.

Randy and Gabe Godsey from Papillion Public Works competed against 66 operators from across the nation in a backhoe operation skills course.

Randy, qualified by finishing first at a state competition. The trip was financed by the Nebraska Chapter of the American Public Works Association.

While no trophies were brought back to Nebraska, Randy had the opportunity to network with operators from across the country, attend an equipment exhibition with over 400 vendors and sit in on educational classes offered through the conference.

Winter Season Reminders

The winter season will soon be here and the Public Works Department has a couple reminders regarding snow emergencies and clearing residential sidewalks after a storm.

Snow Emergency

When two or more inches of snow, ice and/or sleet has fallen, or when a snow emergency has been declared with notice to the news media, vehicles cannot be parked on any public street for 24 hours or until the street has been plowed. Any vehicle that is not moved will be towed at the owner's expense.

Clearing Sidewalks

Sidewalks in all residential areas of the City of La Vista are required to be cleaned of any snow, sleet, mud or ice within 24 hours after the end of a storm. Sidewalks in a business district must be cleaned within five hours after the end of the storm unless the snow fall took place during the night, in which case the sidewalk shall be cleaned before 8:30 a.m. the following day.

Christmas Tree Recycling Sites Open Through January 15

The City of La Vista is once again offering free drop sites for Christmas trees at the following locations:

- La Vista Soccer Complex parking lot (two blocks south of Harrison Street on 66th Street)
- Kelly West Parking Lot (87th Street and Park View Boulevard)

Drop off sites will be open December 26 to January 15. All decorations, tinsel and plastic bags must be removed prior to disposal. The collected trees will be chipped into mulch, which is available to residents free of charge.


