

City of La Vista
Park & Recreation Advisory Committee Minutes
May 19, 2021

A meeting of the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee for the City of LaVista convened in open and public session at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, May 19, 2021. Present was Asst. Recreation Director David Karlson, Youth and Adult Sports Manager Denny Dinan, Senior Services Manager Kaily Stanley, Administrative Assistant Sue Tangeman, Public Works Foreman Jeff Thornburg, Advisory Board Chairperson Pat Lodes, Members Jeff Kupfer, Brenda Mechels-Stuby and Bobette Jones. Absent: Recreation Director Scott Stopak.

A notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Papillion Times on May 12, 2021. Simultaneously given to the members of the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee and a copy of their acknowledgment of receipt of the notice are attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated, in advance notice to the members of the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter were taken while the convened meeting was open to attendance of the public. Further, all the subjects included in said proceedings were contained in the agenda for inspection within ten working days after said meeting, prior to the convened meeting of said body.

CALL TO ORDER

Asst. Director David Karlson called the meeting to order.

Karlson led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Karlson made an announcement of the location of the posted copy of the Open Meetings Act for public reference and read the Emergency Procedures Statement.

2. REPORTS FROM RECREATION DIRECTOR AND STAFF

The **Virtual Recreation Center** featured a variety videos from mid-March through Mid-April. Those included:

- Our Fun Friday **Recreation @ Home** monthly calendar video for May.
- A live-stream during our annual **Arbor Day Celebration** was held on Friday, April 30 at 6:00 p.m. by the Central Park trail head near the pond. This year's celebration featured our new Memorial Tree program. Our first memorial tree was dedication to Mayor Andy Anderson who past-away last year. Following the dedication family can stroll around the pond for a book walk. The book walk has pages of a book placed on signs that are spread out around the pond so patrons can read the story as they walk around the pond. At the end of the book walk, patrons received a free tree sapling and a take-home craft to celebrate Arbor Day.

The Community Center was the site for **COVID-19 Vaccination Clinics** sponsored by the Sarpy/Cass County Health Department on Tuesday, May 11 & 18.

Ages allowed: 19 and over only (the same as we have had in place during Covid)

In June, we are reopening our on-site ENOA meal program. Meals will still be prepackaged as they have been during Covid and the Grab 'n Go Lunch program. We will also be offering our evening and weekend classes on-site.

YOUTH AND ADULT SPORTS

Adult Programs:

Women's Volleyball: The Spring session ended on May 5. The next session will begin in September. Six of the 8 spring session teams said they will return for the Fall session. The other 2 teams are undecided.

Softball Summer League:

Senior League: games started the week of April 12. 1 league plays on Mon/Wed night (16 teams) and the other league plays on Friday mornings.

Adult Softball: games started the week of April 5. We have 16 teams in our Thursday Double Header League and 6 teams in our Friday Night League.

Youth Programs:

All youth baseball, soccer, softball, and flag football teams began practices on April 5 and games started the last week of April.

Baseball: 2021=52 players/4 teams; 2020=40 players/3 teams; 2019=100 players/8 teams

Flag Football Summer: 2021=123 players/13 teams; 2020=Covid-league cancelled.

2019=78 players/9 teams.

Soccer 3 yr. old Summer Clinic: 15 players (maximum enrollment)

Soccer Summer Academy/League: 2021=89 players; 2020 Covid-league cancelled; 2019 = 67 players

Girls Softball: 2021=71 players/6 teams; 2020 = 32 players/3 teams 2019=57 players/4 teams

Coed T-ball: 2021=70 players; 2020=Covid- league cancelled; 2019=56 players.

SENIOR CENTER
