





The Youth Police Academy (YPA) is designed to provide middle school students a better understanding of law enforcement practices. The academy introduces participants to the field of law enforcement and provides an opportunity for youth and police officers to connect. Students attend a mock police academy involving lectures, role-playing, topical demonstrations and team-building exercises.

The Academy includes structured activities designed to highlight the four cardinal work principles of teamwork, leadership, communication and problem-solving/conflict resolution. There is NO COST to students who wish to attend the academy. Class size is limited to 20 participants. Lunch and t-shirt provided.

Topics include: *How to Become a Police Officer, SWAT, CSI, K9, Juvenile Justice Center, 911 Call Center, CPR, Team-building exercises, Stop the Bleed Training*, and other interactive learning activities oriented around law enforcement.

Do you want a quiet workout experience free from distractions that has everything you need to weight train or get in shape? We have you covered! Our fitness center offers state-of-the-art weight equipment, such as the Freemotion Dual Cable Cross, Hoist multi-gym, Smith machine, and dumbbells up to 50 pounds. We even have exercise mats and a multi-purpose pull-up bar. For cardiovascular exercise, you will find some of the finest, user-friendly, aerobic equipment available, including: a Stages Solo bike, Helix recumbent lateral trainer, NuStep recumbent cross trainers, Cybex Arc cross trainers, 1st Degree row machines, an Airdyne bike, ellipticals and treadmills.

LA VISTA CITY FIELDS

The City of La Vista has baseball, softball, flag football and soccer fields available at La Vista Sports Complex, City Park and Central Park West. The fields open on April 1 and close on October 31, weather permitting. These fields are available through permit only from the Recreation Department. The fee for obtaining a permit is \$40 per two hours per field. Tournament rates vary.

To request a field or if you are interested in hosting a tournament, please contact Denny Dinan at **402.331.3455**. All field requests must be submitted at least 24 hours in advance.





Kaily: I've been working in the senior recreation field for about 20 years. I'm a Certified Therapeutic Recreation Specialist and prior to coming to work for La Vista, I worked for a local nursing home as an Activities Director.

LV: What is your favorite part of your job?

Kaily: I get to combine my love for seniors and recreation, plus it's incredibly rewarding to make a difference for someone each day. Bringing the seniors joy, bringing them happiness and being able to provide services they might not otherwise receive.

LV: What is your favorite thing about working with seniors?

Kaily: There are so many things! But I love getting to know their life story and what kinds of things they enjoy!

LV: Why is it important for seniors to connect with others on a regular basis?

Kaily: It's so important to connect with others, especially, to avoid social isolation! Getting together with other people has so many health benefits including increasing one's quality of life, increased brain health, reduced blood pressure, improved emotional health, and reducing one's risk for Alzheimer's Disease.

LV: What is something about the La Vista Senior Center that people might not know?



Any person who resides within or through business ownership, pays property taxes to the City of La Vista, is an employee of the City of La Vista, an employee of the Papillion Fire Department, an employee of the Papillion La Vista Community Schools or a current student, faculty or staff of Metropolitan Community College may apply for a library card at no charge. Non-residents (those living outside the city limits) may obtain a card by paying a fee as set forth in the City's Master Fee Ordinance.

New patrons requesting a library card will be required to show identification with proof of address at time of request. Library cards can be issued to all who are 16 years of age and older and minor ages 5-15 with parental consent.

BORROWING PRIVILEGES

Within the Library, the use of all materials is open to the public. Service will not be denied or abridged because of religious, racial, social, economic, political, or age status. The use of the Library or its services may be denied for due cause including, but not limited to, failure to return books or pay fees, destruction of Library property, or failure to abide by stated Library policies.

COMPUTERS & WiFi

Computers, high-speed internet, free Wi-Fi, wireless printing and Microsoft Office are available to the public. Printouts cost \$0.10 per page for black & white and \$0.50 per page for color.

IPADS

Library card holders, in good standing, can borrow an iPad for use within the Library. To checkout an iPad, cardholders must be 18 years old or older and fill out the iPad Usage Agreement form. iPads can be borrowed for 60 minutes at a time with time extension options available.

Text **402.204.1537** to text-chat with a librarian. You can easily renew your books, receive notification whenever items are overdue, or ask a reference question. For privacy reasons, titles of books and personal information may not be shared through Gabbie.

MAKERSPACE


Due to the popularity of the Library Innovation Studio the Library hosted in 2021, we've created our own makerspace area. All Library users are invited to create, innovate and collaborate! Contact Library staff for more information and to schedule a time to explore in our makerspace area.

What is makerspace?

It is a room or area that empowers community members with the tools and guidance to explore, collaborate, create, learn and invent through participatory learning experiences.

This is a hands-on discovery area designed to stimulate creativity, innovation and the exchange of ideas to facilitate entrepreneurship, skills development and local economic development.

This communal area encourages natural creativity and fosters play and open-ended learning.



MAKERSPACE EQUIPMENT AVAILABLE:

AccuCut Die-Cutting Machine & Dies

A hand-operated machine combined with a steel-rule die allows user to cut through anything you can cut with scissors. Bring your own paper and use our machine and dies to create different patterns. Users must bring their own paper.

Laser Cutter

The Library owns a Universal Laser System for use by staff and the public who have been trained on all aspects of the equipment. Before being permitted to use the laser cutter on their own, users must undergo training and meet general safety guidelines as well as fill out the Laser Cutter Usage Agreement form. Makers ages 12-17 may use the laser cutter with non-staff direct adult supervision, and anyone over the age of 18 can use the laser cutter unsupervised. Cost varies and depends on consumables purchased from the Library. Makers may bring their own consumables, but they must meet the guidelines of the laser cutter and be preapproved by Library staff before using.

Tinker Boxes

A box with a wide variety of materials that allows kids to use their imaginations and create different things.

3D Pens

Doodle, sketch, and paint in 3D.

3D Printer

The Library owns a MakerBot Replicator + 3D Printer for use by staff and the public who have been trained to print items in PLA filament. Before being permitted to use the printer on their own, users must undergo training and meet general safety guidelines as well as fill out the 3D Printer Usage Agreement form. Makers ages 12-15 may use the 3D printer with non-staff direct adult supervision, and those over the age of 16 can use the 3D printer unsupervised. You must use the Library's filament. Prints cost 10¢ per gram of PLA filament. By appointment only.

Crinkle-Cut Craft Scissors

Lets users create scallops, ripples, waves and more. Each pair features a different design.

Snap Circuits

Hands-on introduction to electronics featuring color-coded, real circuit components that snap together to create working electronic circuits and devices.

Button Maker

Create your own button to show off your favorite character, advertise your business, use as party favors or for an event to promote a campaign. Fees apply when creating buttons.



At Your Service

Meet Karen Graff, Circulation Clerk

Karen Graff is a member of the Library staff, and also a public notary. Read our interview with Karen and learn more about her and her experience working in the Library.

LVPL: Tell us about yourself.

Karen: I retired from teaching at the elementary level in 2015. In addition to elementary education, I studied deaf education as an undergrad. I always wanted to work with deaf and hard-of-hearing children so now I am a substitute teacher for preschool children with those challenges.

Of course, I love to read and enjoy the extra time I now have to read for leisure. Besides kids and books, I love dogs! I had a dachshund for 12 years and now have two miniature dachshunds (brothers) who keep me busy.

LVPL: How long have you worked at the Library?

Karen: I've been working here for 6 years since I retired from education.

LVPL: What is your role at the Library and what inspired you to apply for this role?

Karen: I'm a circulation assistant which means I have several roles. I work at the circulation desk checking materials in and out, I shelve materials, and I work at the reference desk answering questions about resources and computer usage. There are many different tasks which keep the job interesting.

First, my love for reading makes the Library one of my favorite places. I was a student librarian for three years in elementary school and considered library science as a career before deciding on education. The Library gives me the opportunity to work with children and to be surrounded by books.

LVPL: What do you value about the Library?

Karen: It has so many important resources. You can get the most current information, research historical events, and find anything in between. Personally, I enjoy borrowing books to read, the traditional role of the Library.

LVPL: Why is the Library an important part of the community?

Karen: Libraries are a treasure! If you can't find the information or resources you are seeking, someone at the Library can probably find it for you. If you can't physically visit the Library, there are many options to connect remotely through technology which has become especially important during the pandemic. We can suggest outside resources to access many public services. We offer a variety of programs that are entertaining, informative, and usually free. There is something for everyone of all ages, abilities, cultures, and interests. It's a safe, welcoming place.

LVPL: What book are you currently reading?

Karen: I'm reading *The Kitchen Front* by Jennifer Ryan. My favorite genre is historical fiction, especially by authors who have done extensive research on their topics. It encourages me to learn more about the actual events that are addressed in the books since I also enjoy studying history.

2ND ANNUAL TINY ART SHOW






