


City Council Ward Map



LA VISTA CITY FIELDS

The City of La Vista has baseball, softball, flag football and soccer fields available at La Vista Sports Complex, City Park and Central Park West. The fields open on April 1 and close on October 31, weather permitting. These fields are available through permit only from the Recreation Department. The fee for obtaining a permit is \$40 per two hours per field. Tournament rates vary.

NEW

PICKLEBALL

The fastest-growing sport in the United States now officially has space for play in La Vista! This fun sport is played on a court the same dimensions as badminton and also combines elements of tennis and ping-pong. It can be played both indoors and outdoors with a paddle and a plastic ball with holes. The game can be played as doubles or singles and is a sport accessible by all ages and skill levels.



OUTDOOR COURTS

The three tennis courts at Central Park East are now multipurpose courts that can be used for playing both tennis and pickleball. Different colored lines were added to the tennis courts to mark the pickleball courts, and the existing tennis nets can be used for playing either sport. Please note that the nets on these courts are removed during the winter months.

INDOOR COURTS

REFUND POLICY

At Your Service

Meet Brian Allen, Community Events Coordinator

As the Events Coordinator, Brian Allen helps plan, coordinate and execute all the special events for the residents of the La Vista community. Read our interview with Brian to learn more about his experience.

LV: How long have you worked for the City of La Vista?

Brian: I joined the team in February 2022 and was able to jump right into programming and logistics for the annual Salute to Summer celebration last May. Some initial event highlights for me include hearing live local music in the park, trivia nights at Kros Strain Brewing, the Arbor Day storytime walk and tree planting in Central Park, and Yappy Hour at the La Vista Dog Park. A new annual event, Howl-O-Ween at the Dog Park in October won't disappoint either!

LV: Where did you work before coming to La Vista?

Brian: When events fell flat at the start of the Covid-19 pandemic, I pivoted and worked as a substitute teacher for grades PK-12 at three different school districts. Prior to that, I worked as an Assistant General Manager for a local non-profit art house theater and co-founded the state's first indoor climbing gym. My degree in Construction Management might not seem very relatable, but I have found similarities when it comes to planning, scheduling, logistics and being able to collaborate and make sound decisions on site when the pressure is on.

LV: What is your favorite part of your job?

Brian: Having the freedom and time to dream up new programming while executing the logistics to help create memorable experiences for the residents of La Vista and surrounding communities. None of this is possible without the support of so many departments and staff at City Hall, Recreation, Community Development, Library, Fire, Police, Public Works and community volunteers as well.

LV: What is your favorite thing about working in events?

Brian: No day or night is ever the same and that keeps me on my toes physically and mentally! Over the years I have learned to embrace a flexible schedule that may include early mornings, late nights or the weekend. There is no shortage of issues when it comes to producing live events, but I enjoy anticipating and solving logistical and service problems. The more I pre-plan and envision, the easier it is for myself and my team to solve problems that arise. It's a special opportunity to be able to bring people together for the betterment of a community.

LV: Why are events important to the life of a community?

Brian: I believe communities become more understanding and healthier when people spend time together and special events help facilitate this for a better quality of life.

LV: What is something about La Vista's events that the community might not know?

Brian: Nearly all the community events in La Vista are free to attend! Programming city events will continue to evolve as we open new facilities with the development of the upper and lower-level pavilion areas (The Link) that are connected to the expanded Central Park, the new outdoor amphitheater and public spaces within City Centre. We are looking forward to producing events that incorporate traditional aspects, but also bringing new components to the mix.

LV: What is one thing you like to do when you're not at work?

Brian: I enjoy tending to my garden.

LV: What do you love about La Vista?

Brian: When I think about Greater Omaha and Sarpy County, La Vista is in the middle of everything with a style all its own. Small gestures go a long way here and the big vision is starting to come to fruition with continued progress at the City Centre and Southport developments.



Any person who resides within the city limits of La Vista and pays property taxes to the City of La Vista or is a La Vista business owner may apply for a library card. In addition, any person who is an employee of the City of La Vista, a member of the Papillion Fire Department, a teacher or faculty member in a La Vista public school, or a current student, staff or faculty member of Metropolitan Community College may apply for a library card at no charge. Non-residents (those living in a Sanitary Improvement District or outside the city limits) may obtain a membership by paying a fee as set forth in the City's Master Fee Ordinance. There is no charge for a library card for active military personnel who live in Sarpy County.

New patrons requesting a library card will be required to show identification with proof of address at the time of request. Library cards can be issued to all who are 16 years of age and older, and minors ages 5-15, with parental consent.

BORROWING PRIVILEGES

Within the library, the use of all materials is open to the public. Service will not be denied or abridged because of religious, racial, social, economic, political, or age status. The use of the library or its services may be denied for due cause including, but not limited to, failure to return books or pay fees, destruction of library property, or failure to abide by stated library policies.

COMPUTERS & WiFi

Computers, high-speed internet, free Wi-Fi, wireless printing and Microsoft Office are available to the public. Printouts cost \$0.10 per page for black & white and \$0.50 per page for color.

iPADS

Library card holders, in good standing, can borrow an iPad for use within the Library. To checkout an iPad, cardholders must be 18 years old or older and fill out the iPad Usage Agreement form. iPads can be borrowed for 60 minutes at a time with time extension options available.

GABBIE: A TEXT-A-LIBRARIAN SERVICE

Text **402.204.1537** to text-chat with a librarian. You can easily renew your books, receive notification whenever items are overdue, or ask a reference question. For privacy reasons, titles of books and personal information may not be shared through Gabbie.

DIGITAL RESOURCES

The Library offers online resources, electronic books, magazines, and streaming media, movies and music that can be accessed at the Library or from any computer with an Internet connection. Access information for those resources that require a username and password is available at the Library. Contact the Library or visit the Library's website for a complete list of digital resources.

CAKE PAN COLLECTION

Did you know that you can check out cake pans with your library card? The library's new Cake Pan Collection is available and has a variety of holiday themed and character cake pans, decorating supplies, and access to a variety of different recipes located on a special library blog!

The new collection was spearheaded by Papillion La Vista High School Junior Millie Belik to earn her Gold Award from the Girl Scouts.

The Gold Award is the highest and most prestigious honor a Girl Scout can earn. It requires the scout to dedicate 80+ hours on a community service project that will make a difference in the world. Millie chose the library because she spent a lot of time at the library when she was younger and she wanted to give back.

Library staff was thrilled with the idea of a Cake Pan Collection because these tools support creativity and give people access to needed things at little to no cost. Baking isn't hard when you have a library card!



MAKERSPACE

A makerspace is a place dedicated to creating, individual thinking and open-ended learning. Community members use a variety of tools, various art supplies and building materials to create. This is a hands-on discovery area. Equipment available includes:

3D Printer

The Library owns a MakerBot Replicator + 3D Printer for use by the public who have been trained to print items in PLA filament. Before being permitted to use the printer on their own, users must undergo training and meet general safety guidelines as well as fill out the 3D Printer Usage Agreement form. Makers ages 12-15 may use the 3D printer with non-staff direct adult supervision, and those over the age of 16 can use the 3D printer unsupervised. It is required to use the Library's filament. Prints cost 10¢ per gram of PLA filament. By appointment only.

Tinker Boxes

A tinker box is simply a box filled with a variety of supplies that encourages library users to free build, create, and problem solve with little to no guidance. All supplies are in each box and can be played with at the library.

AccuCut Die-Cutting Machine & Dies

A hand-operated machine combined with a steel-rule die allows users to cut through anything that can be cut with scissors. Bring your own paper and use our machine and dies to create different patterns.

Button Maker

Create your own button to show off your favorite character, advertise your business, use as party favors or to promote a campaign. Fees apply when creating buttons.

Laser Cutter

The Library owns a Universal Laser System for use by the public who have been trained on all aspects of the equipment. Before being permitted to use the laser cutter on their own, users must undergo training and meet general safety guidelines as well as fill out the Laser Cutter Usage Agreement form. Makers ages 12-17 may use the laser cutter with non-staff direct adult supervision, and anyone over the age of 18 can use the laser cutter unsupervised. Cost varies and depends on consumables purchased from the Library. Makers may bring their own consumables, but they must meet the guidelines of the laser cutter and be preapproved by Library staff before using. Laser cutter use is by appointment only.

Other Supplies and Tools

In addition to the big makerspace tools, the library offers a variety of smaller tools too. These include stencils, rubber stamps, crinkle cut scissors, paper hole punchers and more! Neither paper nor ink will be provided.

Lamination Machine

The library has a laminating machine available for your laminating needs. Fees apply when laminating. You will need to contact the library at least 30 minutes in advance so the laminator will have time to warm-up. Laminating will be done by library staff.

UNATTENDED CHILDREN

Children ages 10 and under must be accompanied by a parent or adult caregiver and under appropriate supervision. Please be aware that this is a public facility, and the safety and security of children are the responsibility of the parent or adult caregiver.



BOARD GAMES

Do you like playing games? Do you want to try one before your family decides to make a purchase? Board games can be played at the Library or checked out for three weeks for use outside of the Library. Borrowers are responsible for returning the game with all its pieces and accessories. Please note that board games must be returned inside the Library or a \$5 fee will be charged if a game is returned in the drop box. We hope this will allow families a chance to have a good time together and build relationships. Come and check out a board game from the Library!




ZOO PASSES



At Your Service

Meet Ashley Wemhoff, Teen Coordinator

Ashley Wemhoff is a member of the Youth Services Division at the Library. She enjoys working with teens and providing quality programs to meet their needs. Read our interview with Ashley and learn more about her and her experience working in the library.

LVPL: Tell us about yourself.

Ashley: I grew up in the Omaha metro area and my family moved to La Vista when I was in the 5th grade. The La Vista Public Library is actually where I got my first library card! I went to college at UNO and graduated in 2017 with my bachelor's degree in Library and Information Science. I'm currently pursuing my master's degree in the same field through an online program.

In my free time, when I'm not reading, I love to bake or cook. As the teens who come to my programs know, there is almost always food!

LVPL: How long have you worked at the Library?

Ashley: I've been working at the La Vista Public Library since 2019. I started as a part-time employee and was recently moved to full-time last December. Prior to that, I worked at the Ralston Public Library in their children's department.

LVPL: What is your role at the Library and what inspired you to apply for this role?

Ashley: I am the teen coordinator, so in broad terms, that means I'm in charge of the teen department. I plan programs for high school and middle school students, select materials for the teen area, and visit schools and other youth groups in the community to promote the library's resources. I also serve as the advisor on the library's Teen Advisory Board which is a group of 7th-12th grade students who give feedback on how the library can better serve young people.

I've always wanted to work with teens, so this job was the perfect fit for me! I could probably see myself working in a different department in the library, but I don't think I would enjoy it nearly as much.

LVPL: What do you value about the Library?

Ashley: One of the things I value most is the sense of community. It's really easy to get to know the residents who come in regularly and chat with us. I imagine that even in big cities you'll be able to get a bit of that small town feel if you visit the local library.

LVPL: Why is the Library an important part of the community?

Ashley: Libraries are really information hubs of their community! Students of all ages come to get help with their coursework, citizens stop by to get resources on their favorite hobbies, leisure readers come to chat about their favorite books, and parents and grandparents bring their children in to learn and explore. There's always something new going on at the library!

LVPL: What book are you currently reading?

Ashley: I tend to have three or four books that I'm reading at a time, but I will say that one of my most recent favorites has been *Luck of the Titanic* by Stacey Lee. The book is about a British-Chinese girl who sneaks aboard the Titanic in the hopes of making it to America. She dreams of joining a circus and becoming an acrobat along with her twin brother. I think you might already have a good idea of how the book ends, but if you want to see who survives the Titanic's inevitable demise, you'll have to read it yourself.




