

# BIENNIAL BUDGET

The FY25-FY26 Biennial Budget demonstrates the City's commitment to providing excellent services and amenities for residents while ensuring the City's financial health.

The total budget of \$58.3M in FY25 and \$49.6M in FY26 aligns with the strategic priorities established by the Mayor and city council and continues with investments in key infrastructure projects. La Vista emphasizes economic development through public infrastructure, tourism, and effective municipal services, catering to a growing population. Challenges from being landlocked necessitate innovative growth strategies.

We understand property tax concerns and are committed to property tax reform and transparent governance. The City faces challenges, just like our residents. It is impacted by the need to control property tax while facing inflation, rising fuel prices, and increased costs.


On page 4, the monthly cost of City services is identified for the owner of a home in La Vista valued at \$222,900. Currently, City related property taxes account for approximately 1.7% of an average monthly household budget.

## GENERAL FUND

The General Fund is the City's main operating fund. It pays for the majority of the day-to-day services and programs that keep La Vista running. Property and sales taxes are the largest General Fund revenue sources.

### GENERAL FUND REVENUE SOURCES

Multiple revenue sources sustain La Vista's General Fund.



#### PROPERTY TAX — \$12.6M

For every \$100 of assessed valuation, the City receives \$.54. The **General Fund** receives \$.50. (*An additional \$.04 goes to the Debt Service Fund.*) The majority of your property taxes support local schools.

#### SALES TAX — \$6.1M

For every \$100 in purchases made, residents, businesses and visitors pay \$7.50 in sales tax. The majority of the sales tax, \$5.50, benefits the State, while the City receives approximately \$2. The **General Fund** receives \$1, and, as approved by voters, \$.50 goes to both the Redevelopment Fund for 84th Street infrastructure improvements and the Debt Service Fund for streets and other public infrastructure.

#### OTHER — \$2.8M

Revenue categories less than \$1M are combined in Other. These categories include Occupation & Franchise Taxes, Interest Income, Recreation Fees, Special Services, Grant Income, Parking Garage Fees, Permits & Licensing and Miscellaneous.

#### INTER-GOVERNMENTAL — \$2.5M

The City receives a distribution from the State of Nebraska of Highway Allocation revenue, which includes fuel taxes and other motor vehicle fees from the State.

#### HOTEL TAX — \$1.1M

Hotels pay a monthly occupation tax equal to 5% of gross receipts from room rentals.

#### RESTAURANT TAX — \$700K

Restaurants and drinking places pay a monthly occupation tax equal to 1.5% of gross prepared food and beverage receipts.



Santa Claus is coming to town! Catch your first glimpse of him this season during Santa's Sleigh Ride and Tree Lighting Celebration on Sunday, December 1.

### Sleigh Ride **1-5 p.m.**

We are excited to welcome Santa to La Vista and see him make his way through our neighborhoods during his annual Sleigh Ride. Residents of all ages will delight in waving at Santa as he passes by on his sleigh with his entourage.

Santa's Sleigh Ride will take place from 1-5 p.m. Here are some tips to help you keep track of Santa, so you know when to expect him in your area:



#### Use the QR code to see a route map.

**map.** Santa and his crew will begin on the west side of 84th Street and work their way east. They will be west of 84th Street approximately 1-3 p.m. and travel through the neighborhoods east of 84th Street around 3-5 p.m.

**Download the Glympse app** and use it to track Santa's sleigh as it travels through La Vista. Find the app and instructions for using it at [CityofLaVista.org/SleighRide](http://CityofLaVista.org/SleighRide).

**Anticipate Santa's arrival and make your way outside before he gets to your street.** We have it on record that Santa passes by streets more quickly if no one is outside. He and his crew will travel more slowly when they come across people. So, be sure to be outside and ready so he can spot you!

### Tree Lighting **6 p.m.**

Once Santa has completed his trip through the City, he will make his way through Central Park to light the tree outside his workshop, lead a singalong and take a selfie with the community.

Santa won't arrive until approximately 5:45 p.m., but you're welcome to visit the workshop starting at 4 p.m. You can get a sneak peak inside the workshop and enjoy fun and treats outdoors.

Sip on free hot cocoa, grab a cookie and a glow necklace, pet and take photos with the live animals and listen to the carolers while you wait for Santa's arrival. Those who want to capture some festive photos can make their way over to The Link to find the two selfie spots at the boardwalk and The Nines Plaza. ## Public Works Is Practiced and Prepared for Storm Response

From winter weather to summer storms, La Vista residents can depend on Public Works to respond during all types of weather emergencies.

Immediately after a severe thunderstorm tore through the metro area on the evening of July 31, La Vista Public Works employees began canvassing the City to assess damage. High winds and heavy rain had created numerous safety hazards for residents. Streets were littered with fallen trees, branches and debris. Twenty-five streets were completely blocked. Several traffic signals and stop signs were damaged, and much of the City was without power.

Public Works crews worked alongside La Vista Police and Papillion Fire first responders to identify safety issues and needs.

Public Works Director Joe Soucie explained that clearing the roads and ensuring streets were passable for emergency responders and residents was a top priority in the hours after the storm—and Public Works employees answered the call.

*“Part of our original response was getting streets opened back up as soon as possible,” Soucie said. “That was done within about a three-hour window.”*

Public Works was prepared to activate employees quickly thanks to an efficient call out protocol they’ve mastered during previous storms. It’s the same process they will use this upcoming winter when snow falls and roads need to be cleared.

“We’ve actually got a detailed call out list of employees who are ready to go, so it’s just a matter of figuring out how many you need,” said Soucie. “We can usually get folks in here within 30 to 60 minutes and be ready to go.”

During the July storm, clearing roads was just the first step in the cleanup process. Crews also coordinated a debris drop-off site and organized a curbside debris pickup for all La Vista residents.

In just eight days, Public Works crews made two complete passes through the City to pick up residents’ debris.

Soucie said coordinating cleanup efforts went smoothly because Public Works was prepared to

implement plans they’d used successfully in the past. The department also had most of the necessary equipment on hand, with the exception of a couple pieces they rented.



*“Being able to get through the whole city in about eight days with a curbside cleanup was huge,” Soucie said.*

“Crews had a good spirit, really got after it and got things done in a timely manner. That got us back into cleaning up parks and trails.”

Helping with the senior program meals gives the volunteers a sense of purpose. It also keeps away loneliness. The group clearly enjoys each other's company. They've jokingly adopted a motto: What happens in the kitchen stays in the kitchen.

Stanley said she would like to add a few more volunteers and encourages others with free time to consider joining the group.

"We couldn't provide the type of lunch experience we do for seniors without our volunteers," Stanley said. "We're so appreciative of them and what they do for our program."

## CODE ENFORCEMENT CORNER

By the time you are reading this, it may have already snowed in La Vista. If not, snow will inevitably be on its way soon. With that in mind, here are a few snow-related code reminders.

- Snow must be removed from business areas within five hours of snow ending.
- For residential properties, snow must be removed from sidewalks within 24 hours of snow ending.
- When a snow emergency occurs, City of La Vista plows need street clearance, and it is unlawful for any automobile to be parked on any public street in La Vista for 24 hours or longer depending on the length of the emergency. Please stay tuned to local news outlets and the City's social media resources for information and updates about snow emergencies in La Vista.



The La Vista Police Department is pleased to introduce two of its newest police officers—welcome additions to the department.




## Steven Morris

After a brief retirement and a short stint in the private sector, Officer Hrabik felt the call to return to policing. He chose to become an officer with the La Vista Police Department.


