COMMUNITY CENTER

The La Vista Community Center offers a variety of ways for you and your family to stay fit and enjoy recreational time together. The Community Center features five meeting rooms for rent and programming, a fitness center, racquetball & wallyball court, basketball court with three pickleball courts, and a game room. The Community Center is home to seniors and recreation programs offered daily and weekly. There are daily fees to utilize the basketball court and fitness center, and rental fees for the use of meeting rooms, pickleball courts, and racquetball & wallyball court.

REGISTRATION PROCESS

To access the Community Center, every individual must register for free and receive a unique identification number. This number will be used for check-ins each time you visit.

For youth aged 10-15 years old, registration must be completed by a parent or guardian before they can use the facility independently.

Please note that children aged 9 and under will not be issued an identification number and must always be accompanied by a parent or guardian who is at least 16 years old.

FITNESS CENTER

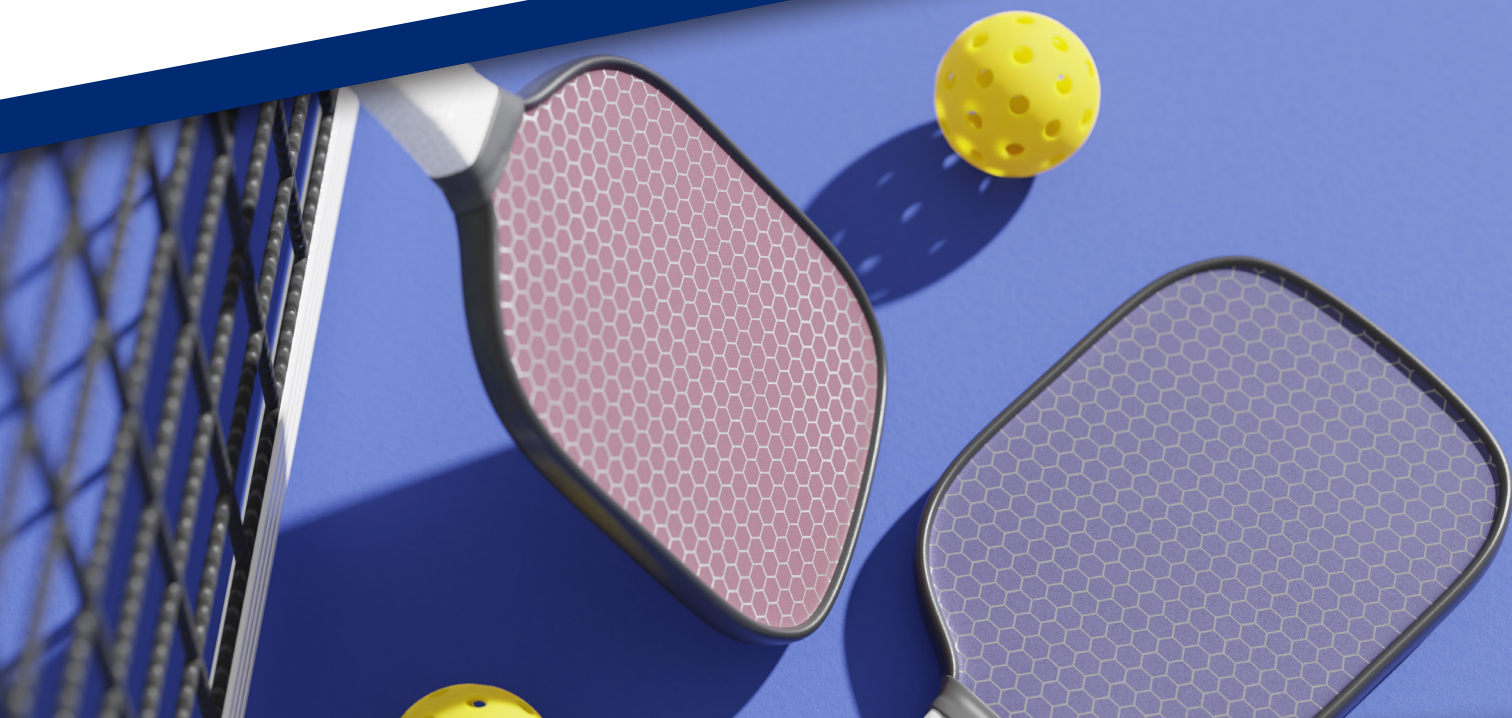

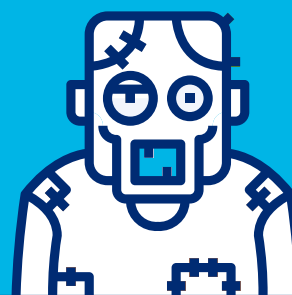

Any person who resides within the City of La Vista, pays property taxes to the City of La Vista or is a La Vista business owner may apply for a library card. In addition, any person who is an employee of the City of La Vista, a member of the Papillion Fire Department, a teacher or faculty member in a La Vista public school, or a current student or staff of Metropolitan Community College may apply for a library card at no charge.

Non-residents (those living in a Sanitary Improvement District or outside the city limits) may obtain membership by paying a fee as set forth in the City's Master Fee Ordinance. Due to an agreement between the City and SID 237, the City agrees to provide an annual library membership for access and use of library services of the La Vista Public Library to residents of SID 237 who satisfy applicable requirements to obtain a library membership.

Military personnel: There is no charge for a library card for active military personnel who live in Sarpy County. Active military personnel who are not residents of La Vista must present a military ID to obtain a library card.

New patrons requesting a library card will be required to show identification with proof of address at the time of request. Library cards can be issued to all who are 16 years of age and older, and minors ages 5-15, with parental consent.

BORROWING PRIVILEGES

Within the La Vista Public Library, the use of all materials is open to the public. Service will not be denied or abridged because of religious, racial, social, economic, political or age status. The use of the Library or its services may be denied for due cause including, but not limited to, failure to return books or pay fees, destruction of Library property, or failure to abide by stated policies.

COMPUTERS & WiFi

Computers, high-speed internet, free Wi-Fi, wireless printing and Microsoft Office are available to the public. Black and white printouts cost \$0.10 per page/ side, and color printouts cost \$0.50 per page/side.

iPADS

Library cardholders in good standing can borrow an iPad to use within the Library. To check out an iPad, cardholders must be 18 years old or older and fill out the iPad Usage Agreement form. iPads can be borrowed for 60 minutes at a time with time extension options available.

Text **402.204.1537** to text-chat with a librarian. You can easily renew your books, receive notification whenever items are overdue or ask a reference question. For privacy reasons, titles of books and personal information will not be shared through Gabbie.

ELECTRONIC RESOURCES

The La Vista Public Library offers databases, electronic books, magazines, streaming media and streaming music that can be accessed at the Library or from any computer with an Internet connection. The ability to access information for those databases that require a username and password is also available at the Library. At Your Service

Meet Cedate Shultz, Interlibrary Loan/Public Services Librarian

Cedate Shultz is La Vista Public Library's Interlibrary Loan/Public Services Librarian. She plays a crucial role at the Library, assisting patrons with their information needs, how to locate and use the Library's resources and providing research assistance. Cedate promotes literacy, designs and implements adult programming and facilitates book clubs and other community events.

LVPL: Tell us about yourself.

Cedate: I was born and raised in Portland, Oregon. I moved to Nebraska in 2018, first living in Bellevue before settling in La Vista. I live with my very spoiled tabby cat named Ururu (Rue for short) and enjoy spending time with my mom, reading (of course), watching movies and visiting my favorite local attraction, Lauritzen Gardens.

LVPL: How long have you worked at the Library?

Cedate: Just over 6 years.

LVPL: What is your role at the Library and what inspired you to apply for this position?

Cedate: I wear a couple of different hats at our library. I am in charge of Interlibrary Loans. Interlibrary Loan is where we borrow from and lend books to other libraries. I also coordinate programs for members of our community over the age of 18. These programs include multiple book clubs, craft nights and bringing in guest speakers. In addition to this, I am the supervisor during our evening and weekend hours.

My primary reasons for applying to work at La Vista Public Library are a love of service and a love of libraries. From a young age, I have always viewed libraries as safe and welcoming spaces where a person can pursue a love of learning. I have fond memories of my mom taking me to our local library so I could choose something exciting to read. The librarians were always friendly and helpful. 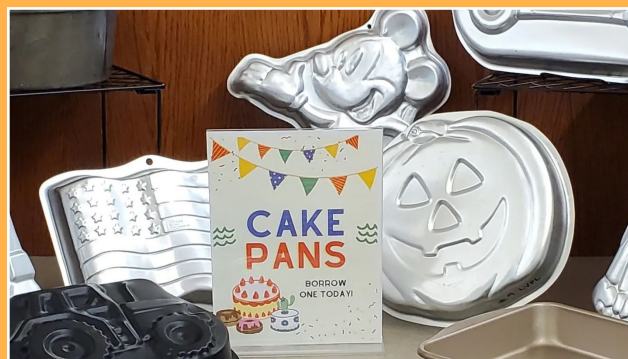
