Park & Recreation Advisory Committee Minutes

January 17, 2024

A meeting of the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee for the City of La Vista convened in open and public session at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, January 17, 2024.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Papillion Times on January 10, 2024. Simultaneously given to the members of the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee and a copy of their acknowledgment of receipt of the notice is attached to the minutes. The availability of the agenda was communicated in advance notice to the members of the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter were taken while the convened meeting was open to attendance of the public. Further, all the subjects included in said proceedings were contained in the agenda for inspection within ten working days after said meeting, prior to the convened meeting of said body.

1. CALL TO ORDER

Assistant Director David Karlson called the meeting to order.

- a. Karlson led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.
- b. Karlson made an announcement of the location of the posted copy of the Open Meetings Act for public reference and read the Emergency Procedures Statement.

2. ROLL CALL

Present was Chairperson Pat Lodes, Members Shaina Owen, Samantha Gentry and Jason Ryan. City Staff present was Assistant Director David Karlson, Parks Superintendent Jason Allen, and Administrative Assistant Sue Tangeman. Absent was Recreation Director Heather Buller.

3. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

- a. Karlson asked for a motion to approve the agenda. Motion made by Member Owen. Seconded by Member Ryan. All aye. Motion carried.

4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

- a. Karlson asked for a motion to approve the minutes from the November 15, 2023 meeting. Motion made by Member Owen. Seconded by Member Ryan. All aye. Motion carried.

5. DISCUSSION, DIRECTION AND ACTION ITEMS

- a. Discussion of future Parks CIP's, Jason Allen, Parks Superintendent
 - Allen discussed the Parks Committee and how they have been working to identify park updates by using a matrix and rating the importance of the updates needed.
 - Two separate matrixes were made for the CIP, one for parks and one for the sports complex.
 - The CIP identified 80 projects for the next 10 years, such as playground updates and Complex lighting replacement.
 - Projects under \$5,000 do not go in the CIP, instead goes into the department budget.
 - In 2024, CIP projects identified: Central Park playground, restrooms and road, and renovation of soccer field #5 will be completed.
- b. Discussion of Tree City USA Report and Annual Application, Jason Allen, Parks Superintendent
 - Allen reported that the report and application were completed this week.
 - La Vista has applied for Tree City every year, and if approved, this will be the 33rd year.
 - In 2023, staff planted 19 trees, pruned approximately 350, and cut down 200 trees.
 - One requirement is to celebrate Arbor Day each year, which will be after lunch this year. Allen invited Pat Lodes to emcee the event.

6. STAFF REPORTS

- a. Recreation Operations Report: David Karlson, Assistant Recreation Director
 - Karlson discussed the November and December Manager's Monthly Report, which included the financial highlights, department operations and event results.
 - Karlson reported that we hired a new Recreation Attendant Shannon McNamara, who came from Las Vegas where she worked at the Recreation Department along with another recently hired attendant Natalie Guzman.
 - Karlson invited everyone to visit the Community Center where there is newly painted walls in different colors, and discussed the new flooring that will be installed soon along with refinishing of the gym floor.
 - In the process of hiring lifeguards for the pool, which will open May 25.
- b. Parks Operation Report: Jason Allen, Parks Superintendent
 - Parks Dept. has focused mainly on snow removal of late.
 - Employees from Parks have been busy painting the inside of the Community Center.

- Parks staff attended a Nebraska Turf Conference.
- Jason and Aaron Johannsen will be attending the Sports Field Management Conference.
- Dutch Sevener from Parks will be attending the Nebraska Arborist Conference.
- Parks has approval to purchase a Turf Tank, which is a robotic turf painter for fields. They have offices in Atlanta and now La Vista, in the new City Centre. A video was shown on how the painter works.
 - Pat Lodes commented on seeing the Turf Tank location on the tour the Members took last fall with Assistant City Administrator Rita Ramirez.
 - Allen said they would be focusing on the soccer fields right now, but baseball and softball fields may come later.
 - A question was asked about how it saves paint. Allen explained how it saves the paint through user application.
 - Also purchased in 2024 was a new wide-area mower.

- All fields are closed from November 1, 2023 - March 31, 2024
- City Park field #2 (PLV High field) will be closed for construction, repair, re-surface from March 2024 – Mid July 2024
- Plans, designs, quotes/bids are being taken for an update to the Community Center basketball court. Painting, replace red padding with navy blue padding, resurface court: completely sand, repaint court lines, paint city logo in navy blue on center court circle, add 3 permanent lined pickle ball courts, re-surface and clear coat the entire gym floor
- Soccer field refurbish 2024: Soccer fields have been used frequently over the years and the constant wear and tear has diminished the quality of these fields. In order for Public Works to repair this damage and get the fields back into better condition the following schedule of field closures will be followed:
 - Field #1 - closed April 1 through August 4
 - Field #5 - closed all season - April 1 through October 31
 - All soccer fields – closed July 1 through August 4
 - Field #4 – closed August 5 through October 31

RECREATION PROJECTS (on-going):

- Central Park East Playground Ribbon Cutting set for December 2 is postponed to Spring 2024. The pour in place surfacing requires temperatures to be above 40 degrees for 48 hours straight. As the seasons have changed, the forecast does not accommodate these needed temperatures. This prevents the contractor from safely installing the surfacing at this time
- Meeting room floor installation approved by City Council December 19 in the amount of \$19,988. Luxury Vinyl Plank flooring will be installed beginning February 5
- Basketball court resurface approved by City Council December 19 in the amount of \$17,927.50, expected April 2024 after basketball season
- Recreation Department Special Services Bus was awarded a 50% reimbursement 5310 Grant in the amount of \$23,851.00. Staff submitted supporting documentation December 13, 2023, and are awaiting a response from Metropolitan Area Planning Agency (MAPA)
