LA VISTA CITY COUNCIL MEETING September 2, 2008

A meeting of the City Council of the City of La Vista, Nebraska was convened in open and public session at 7:00 p.m. on September 2, 2008. Present were Mayor Kindig and Councilmembers: Sell, Ronan, Quick, Sheehan, Carlisle, McLaughlin, Ellerbeck, and Gowan. Also in attendance were City Attorney McKeon, Assistant City Administrator Ramirez, City Engineer Kottmann, City Clerk Buehe, Street Superintendent Goldman, Library Director Iwan, Police Chief Lausten, Fire Chief Uhl, Recreation Director Stopak, Finance Director Lindberg, and Building and Grounds Director Archibald.

A notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Times on August 21, 2008. Notice was simultaneously given to the Mayor and all members of the City Council and a copy of the acknowledgment of the receipt of notice attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated to the Mayor and City Council in the advance notice of the meeting. All proceedings shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public. Further, all subjects included in said proceedings were contained in the agenda for said meeting which is kept continuously current and available for public inspection at City Hall during normal business hours.

REPORTS FROM CITY ADMINISTRATOR AND DEPARTMENT HEADS

Police Chief Lausten informed Council that John Danderand began his first day in the investigation bureau today. Lausten thanked the Public Works Department and the Fire Department for their help at the weekend checkpoint. Along with La Vista Police Department, the Papillion Police Department, Sarpy County, Douglas County, and the State Patrol participated in the "You Drink, You Drive, You Lose" over the Labor Day weekend. Seven people were arrested for being under the influence while driving. Grant funds were used to pay for the overtime involved.

Councilmember McLaughlin asked staff about the burned house at 103rd Street and Harrison. He wanted to know when the home would be demolished. Fire Chief Uhl informed Council the cause of the fire involved a flexible gas pipe, and stated the insurance investigation was completed last week so demolition can begin now. Councilmember Gowan asked what changes are going to be made to building codes to avoid future incidents. Fire Chief Uhl stated he was not sure if there is a fix at this point in time.

Councilmember Gowan asked Community Development Director Birch if the City allowed alternatives and is it something that can be stopped. Community Development Director Birch stated she would check the rules on this. Councilmember Sheehan asked how we could prohibit the use of this pipe for construction in La Vista. Community Development Director Birch stated that Chief Building Official Jeff Sinnett would be doing some work to find out what can be done for current homes and for future building.

Street Superintendent Goldman informed Council the resurfacing of Heather and Josephine Streets is complete, and nearly complete on James and Joseph Streets. Goldman stated there is no timeline on US Asphalt work. Councilmember Sheehan stated he would like to be updated on the Harrison Street project progress. Councilmember Gowan asked if there has been any contact with OPPD on 96th Street. Goldman stated that with the major storm damage in the metro area they are still working to restore street lights which has pushed the 96th project out further. Assistant City Administrator Ramirez stated the project has been moved to the next fiscal year.

Recreation Director Stopak informed Council the La Vista Falls Golf Course had 3979 rounds in August 2008 which is 150 rounds more than in August of 2007 which was a record year. The Golf Course is on pace to do as well as last years record year or exceed it.

Library Director Iwan gave Council a final report from the Summer Reading Program. 481 children and over fifty schools were represented. The library entered a float in the La Vista Days parade. The library used a card system this summer to keep track of all the hours read. 932 Summer Reading Logs were turned in for a total of 4,660 hours. A total of 1928 children participated in the summer program. 58 teens registered for the teen summer reading program. Teens had to complete 50 points. There were 11 events planned for the teens and there were a total of 77 teens attending. There were 28 teen volunteers at the library volunteering a total of 328.5 hours. The library received a letter from Runza restaurants that they take 15% of profits one day each year to support the local library. 15% of all purchases on September 9, 2008 will go to the La Vista library.

B. FISCAL YEAR 07/08 AMENDED MUNICIPAL BUDGET

1. PUBLIC HEARING

At 7:28 p.m. Mayor Kindig opened the public hearing and stated the floor was now open for discussion on the Fiscal Year 07/08 amended Municipal Budget.

At 7:29 p.m. Councilmember Gowan made a motion to close the public hearing. Seconded by Councilmember Ellerbeck. Councilmembers voting aye: Sell, Ronan, Quick, Sheehan, Carlisle, McLaughlin, Ellerbeck, and Gowan. Nays: None. Absent: None. Motion carried.

2. ORDINANCE – APPROVE AMENDED BUDGET

Councilmember Sell introduced Ordinance No. 1072 entitled: AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 1043 AND APPROPRIATE THE SUMS OF MONEY DEEMED NECESSARY TO DEFRAY ALL OF THE NECESSARY EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA FOR THE FISCAL PERIOD BEGINNING ON OCTOBER 1, 2007 AND ENDING ON SEPTEMBER 30, 2008; SPECIFYING THE OBJECTS AND PURPOSES FOR WHICH SUCH APPROPRIATIONS ARE MADE AND THE AMOUNT TO BE APPROPRIATED FOR EACH OBJECT OR PURPOSE; TO REPEAL ORDINANCE NO. 1043 IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT.

Councilmember Quick moved that the statutory rule requiring reading on three different days be suspended. Councilmember Gowan seconded the motion to suspend the rules and upon roll call vote on the motion the following Councilmembers voted aye: Sell, Ronan, Quick, Sheehan, Carlisle, McLaughlin Ellerbeck, and Gowan. The following voted nay: None. The following were absent: None. The motion to suspend the rules was adopted and the statutory rule was declared suspended for consideration of said ordinance.

Said ordinance was then read by title and thereafter Councilmember Ellerbeck moved for final passage of the ordinance which motion was seconded by Councilmember Gowan. The Mayor then stated the question was, "Shall Ordinance No. 1072 be passed and adopted?" Upon roll call vote the following Councilmembers voted aye: Sell, Ronan, Quick, Sheehan, Carlisle, McLaughlin, Ellerbeck, and Gowan. The following voted nay: None. The following were absent: None. The passage and adoption of said ordinance having been concurred on by a majority of all members of the Council, the Mayor declared the ordinance adopted and the Mayor, in the presence of the Council, signed and approved the ordinance and the City Clerk attested the passage/approval of the same and affixed her signature thereto.

C. FISCAL YEAR 08/09 MUNICIPAL BUDGET

1. APPROPRIATIONS ORDINANCE NO. 1065—FINAL READING

Mayor Kindig stated, "Ordinance No. 1065 now comes on for its third and final reading." Councilmember Sheehan introduced Ordinance No. 1065 entitled: AN ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE THE SUMS OF MONEY DEEMED NECESSARY TO DEFRAY ALL OF THE NECESSARY EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA FOR THE FISCAL PERIOD BEGINNING ON OCTOBER 1, 2008 AND ENDING ON SEPTEMBER 30, 2009; SPECIFYING THE OBJECTS AND PURPOSES FOR WHICH SUCH APPROPRIATIONS ARE MADE AND THE AMOUNT TO BE APPROPRIATED FOR EACH OBJECT OR PURPOSE; SPECIFYING THE AMOUNT TO BE RAISED BY TAX LEVY; PROVIDING FOR THE CERTIFICATION OF THE TAX LEVY HEREIN SENT TO THE COUNTY CLERK OF SARPY COUNTY; AND PRESCRIBING THE TIME WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT.

Assistant City Administrator Ramirez stated that it had been brought to her attention that there was a misunderstanding on the part of staff regarding Council direction on this agenda item as it pertains to Mayor and Council salary increases. Upon review of the discussion at the last meeting, Council direction was to bring back the budget for its third reading without the addition of the increases. As there were strong opinions on both sides of this issue she believed it was staff's intent to leave options open for both sides while minimizing the impact on publication procedures. The goal is to approve a final budget document that can be submitted to the State in a timely manner. The changes to the budget since the second reading were a decrease in the property tax request, the addition of the Mayor and Council stipend increase, and the addition of legal fees in the Economic Development Fund.

The Mayor directed City Clerk Bueth to read Ordinance No. 1065 by title; and City Clerk Bueth read the ordinance by title. The Mayor clarified for the record that the proposed budget being considered under Ordinance No. 1065 was the same as the proposed budget presented at the August 19, 2008 Council meeting when Ordinance No. 1065 was read by title for a second time.

City Clerk Bueth had the current proposed budget on file at the meeting. The Mayor stated that any amendments to the proposed budget would be considered before voting on a final budget. Discussion was held regarding proposed changes prepared by Staff for final valuations, additional legal fees related to the economic development program and increases in elected official compensation. The Mayor stated that each proposed amendment would be considered separately.

Councilmember Ellerbeck moved to amend the budget to reflect the property valuation as listed on the blue sheet. Councilmember Sell seconded the motion. Councilmembers voting aye: Sell, Ronan, Quick, Sheehan, Carlisle, McLaughlin Ellerbeck, and Gowan. Nays: None. Absent: None. Motion carried.

Councilmember Sell moved to approve the legal fees which dealt with the Economic Development Fund. Councilmember Ellerbeck seconded the motion. Councilmembers voting aye: Sell, Ronan, Quick, Sheehan, Carlisle, McLaughlin Ellerbeck, and Gowan. Nays: None. Absent: None. Motion carried.

A meeting of the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee for the City of La Vista convened in open and public session at 7:00 p.m. on August 20, 2008. Present were Recreation Director Scott Stopak, Chairperson Greg Johnson, Pat Lodes, George Forst III, Randy Cahill. Absent: John Vendetti. Staff members David Karlson, Rich Carstensen and Eddie Burns were also present.

A notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Papillion Times on August 13, 2008. Simultaneously given to the members of the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee and a copy of their acknowledgment of receipt of the notice are attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice to the members of the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter were taken while the convened meeting was open to attendance of the public. Further, all the subjects included in said proceedings were contained in the agenda for inspection within ten working days after said meeting, prior to the convened meeting of said body.

CALL TO ORDER

Chairperson Johnson called the meeting to order.

Seconded by Advisory Board Member Forst.

Recreation Director Stopak led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Recreation Director Stopak made an announcement of the location of the posted copy of the Open Meetings Act for public reference and read the Emergency Procedures Statement.

A. CONSENT AGENDA

Chairperson Johnson made the motion to approve the consent agenda.

Seconded by Committee Member Lodes. Motion carried.

REPORTS FROM RECREATION DIRECTOR AND STAFF

Recreation Director Scott Stopak stated that a new Public Works La Vista Fall Golf Course Superintendent, Jeff Calentine, began his employment with the City of La Vista last Monday. He previously worked at the Plattsmouth Golf Course. We welcome Jeff to the La Vista Falls Golf Course.

Stopak also reported that the #3 cart path is now finished. It extends down to the bridge leading to the #4 hole, and should allow more golf to be played during rainy days. The hole was only closed 2-3 days, and people replayed hole #6 after hole #9 for a substitution. Stopak also stated that July was the highest round count this year, and beat July of 2007.

Assistant Director David Karlson reported on the indoor garage sale at the La Vista Community Center last Saturday, August 16th. It ran from 10 am to 4 pm, and had 16 vendors. It was very busy in the morning, with a bit slower in the afternoon. All vendors said they would return,

except for one who was actually selling crafts. The Recreation Dept. will have another one, possibly in the spring, and most likely for a shorter period of time.

Karlson also presented the Instructor Interest Form, which we will be putting on-line. It is a guideline for interested parties to fill out if interested in teaching a class at the Recreation Center.

Program Director Rich Carstensen reported on Senior Center activities this month. On Thursday, June 19, twenty Seniors went to Lincoln to tour the Capital, had lunch and visited Hay Market Park and the Sunken Gardens. On Tuesday, August 19th, 25-30 seniors met at the new Summer Kitchen Café in Southport for lunch and had an enjoyable time. In the Fall, tentative plans are to go to Nebraska City for apples and Mahoney State Park for dinner and a play.

Program Coordinator Burns reported that tackle football for 9/10 and 11/12 year olds began practice on August 4th. We were unable to fill a 13/14 year old team by the leagues deadline. Cheerleading, and soccer teams have been formed, and flag football games begin on Saturday.

Burns also reported that the Recreation Dept. has implemented a new registration procedure to begin after October 1st. Instead of have 2-3 months to register for sports, the Recreation Dept. will have 2 different days (one weekday and a Saturday) to register for a sport. A \$10 late registration fee will also be imposed. Hopefully, this will cut down on late registrations and allow for more timelier scheduling of the different youth sports.

B. SWIMMING POOL CONCEPT DISCUSSION

Stopak reported that the City Council approved going forward with a bond issue on the November ballot, with a 7-1 vote.

Public Hearing was opened for comment.

No comments.

Public Hearing was closed.

Member Forst thought that the Advisory Board Members should now go out to the public with information and answers to any questions they may have.

Stopak stated that a group would be formed to present it to the public.

Member Forst thought it would be a good idea to also attend PTO meetings at the schools, and Member Lodes thought that visiting with the Seniors would also be helpful.

C. IDENTIFY COMPETITIVE YOUTH BASEBALL AND SOCCER PROVIDER

The Lancer Soccer Club and the Panthers Baseball Club have been using the City's fields. Fields are getting harder to come by, and more people are requesting space for teams. The need exists to identify, in writing, these two clubs as providers of these sports for the City of La Vista as a means of explanation as to why they have priority over others in scheduling and renting of fields.

Advisory Board Members stated they would like to know how other cities in the area are handling the private clubs in regards to fields. The Members would like to table the discussion

to gather more information. Motion to table was made by Member Lodes and seconded by Member Forst.

D. FIELD USAGE POLICY

Stopak said that the field usage policy needs to be rewritten, where the order of priority for usage of fields would be clearly stated. The Recreation Dept. teams would be first in line, with the others being the Papillion-La Vista School District, the Lancers and Panthers Clubs, and the general public. The school district agreement cannot be placed in jeopardy, since it guarantees the Recreation Dept. teams may utilize gym space at the schools, in priority over other associations. The Recreation Dept. is having multiple requests for fields and gym space, those requesting do not understand why some groups have priority over them, especially if they are a La Vista resident.

Discussion was held by the Advisory Board on how priorities should be designated. The Members requested to table the discussion until further information is gathered. Motion to table was made by Member Lodes and seconded by Chairperson Johnson.

COMMENTS FROM THE FLOOR

No comments.

COMMENTS FROM COMMITTEE MEMBERS

Member Lodes would like staff to meet with both Lancers and Panthers to discuss joining the Recreation Dept., or pay for fields as others do. Member Cahill stated that the staff and the Panthers have had meetings, and the Board of Directors for Panthers Baseball Club had voted to pay usage fees for the fields this year, instead of joining with the Recreation Dept. However, it was going to make a big fiscal impact on the club.

Member Lodes thought it was a very good idea to change the registrations to certain days, as other clubs handle registrations in this way.

The Planning Commission meeting of the City of La Vista was convened at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, August 21, 2008, at the La Vista City Hall, 8116 Park View Boulevard. Members present were: Krzywicki, Alexander, Circo, Andsager, Horihan, Malmquist and Gahan. Carcich was absent. Also in attendance was John Kottman, City Engineer, Marcus Baker, City Planner and Ann Birch, Community Development Director

Legal notice of the public meeting and hearing was posted, distributed and published according to Nebraska law. Notice was simultaneously given to all members of the Planning Commission and a copy of the acknowledgement of the receipt of notice is attached to the minutes. All proceedings shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Krzywicki at 7:00 p.m. Copies of the agenda and staff report were made available to the public.

2. Approval of Meeting Minutes – July 17, 2008

Malmquist motioned to approve the minutes of July 17, 2008, as presented. Horihan seconded the motion. Ayes: Krzywicki, Alexander, Circo, Andsager, Horihan, Malmquist and Gahan. Nays: None. Hewitt abstained. Motion carried.

3. Old Business

A. Revisions to City of La Vista Zoning Ordinance – Section 2.02 Definitions

i. Staff Report: Revisions have been made to the definition section of the Zoning Ordinance to eliminate words or phrases that appear nowhere else in the code; to add definitions to uses that are elsewhere in the code; and to revise content for definitions that are in need of clarity, rewriting, and/or updating.

The American Planning Association's Planning Advisory Service has been utilized to help determine appropriate wording for definitions.

All staff revisions have been submitted, so a final draft will be ready for review on the September Planning Commission Agenda.

Staff recommended continuance of the proposed revisions with any added changes, if applicable.

Malmquist recommended continuance to the September meeting. Hewitt seconded. Ayes: Krzywicki, Alexander, Circo, Andsager, Horihan, Hewitt, Malmquist and Gahan. Nays: None.

4. New Business

A. Amendments to the Capital Improvement Plan

Staff Report: Rita Ramirez, Assistant City Administrator, provided a review of the 2009 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) for the members of the Planning Commission.

Hewitt asked what "CDBG" referred to in the Plan. This is in reference to Community Development Block Grants.

Krzywicki asked if the intent was for the Planning Commission to make a recommendation tonight or if they were allowed more time to review before doing so. Ramirez responded the intent is to present the CIP to the Council at their next meeting during the final budget hearing.

ii. Public Hearing: Gahan motioned to open public hearing. Horihan seconded. Ayes: Krzywicki, Alexander, Circo, Andsager, Horihan, Malmquist, Hewitt and Gahan. Nays: None. Public hearing opened at 7:10 p.m.

Horihan motioned to close the public hearing. Hewitt seconded. Ayes: Hewitt, Krzywicki, Alexander, Circo, Andsager, Horihan, Malmquist and Gahan. Nays: None. Public hearing closed at 7:11 p.m.

Malmquist commented on the clarity and explanation of the product.

Krzywicki asked if there was anyone who is responsible for reviewing the priority of the numbers to ensure that the scoring is done per the requirements on the check sheet. Ramirez said the evaluation sheet follows the criteria outlined in the CIP policies and tends to average out. There is ultimately a lot of input through various stages of the prioritization process.

Circo asked if unfinished low priority items got carried over into the next year again as low priority? He further asked about the means of getting those projects eventually done. Ramirez said these are decisions of council members with recommendation from staff to fund all the projects. Then prioritization begins based on funds available.

Krzywicki asked if the committee's deliberations and each person's scoring sheets were tracked to determine the averages. Ramirez keeps track of these independent of the software they use for the process. Krzywicki asked if this information could be made available in the future. Ramirez said this is possible. She further noted that there is a running five year history.

iii. Recommendation: Circo motioned to recommend approval of the Capital Improvement Plan as submitted to council. Malmquist seconded. Ayes: Hewitt, Krzywicki, Alexander, Circo, Andsager, Horihan, Malmquist and Gahan. Nays: None. Motioned carried.

This item will tentatively appear on the City Council agenda of September 2, 2008.

B. Nebraska Indoor Karting Conditional Use Permit (CUP)

i. Staff Report: Nebraska Indoor Karting, Derek Petit, has requested consideration to open an indoor recreational facility as conditionally permitted in the I-2 Zone District at 8843 S 137 Circle. The property is currently an I-1 Light Industrial zone and contains one existing building which houses flex bays of miscellaneous industrial uses. The Future Land Use Map of the Comprehensive Plan designates this property for industrial uses

The conditional use permit would allow for indoor recreation, specifically indoor kart racing, outdoor laser tag, birthday parties and a video game room. Retail sales are also proposed as an accessory use.

Access to the property would be from an existing drive to S. 137 Circle. The main access currently serves Lot 6. Lot 7, the subject property, shares this access to the main parking area in front. A secondary access does provide access to the back of the building. No sidewalks exist for pedestrian traffic. The city engineer is requesting a new traffic impact study be completed to amend the existing study previously done for the intersection of S. 137 Circle and West Giles Road.

Parking requirements would follow the minimum needed for a recreational facility. Twenty-four spaces currently exist on the site. The applicant reports that up to 40 more spaces may be striped if needed. *Note: the proposed minimum parking requirement for a recreation facility is one space per four occupants.* Parking needs to be adequate for the proposed use on the premises. Any approved parking areas would need to be paved and striped. Shared parking with Lot 6 may be a possibility.

The kart track is proposed to run inside and outside; however, it will be on the interstate side of the building so noise should not be louder than the existing ambient decibel levels. The existing buildings will also provide a noise buffer between the use and the residential area to the west. The building will have an air exchange system to deliver five changes of air per hour.

Staff recommends continuance of the Conditional Use Permit for Nebraska Indoor Karting until the following information can be reviewed by City Staff and Planning Commission:

1. The applicant shall demonstrate that the business can provide the necessary number of parking spaces without negatively impacting the parking required for future or existing tenants on the premises or Lot 6.
2. A landscape plan shall be submitted to the City of La Vista for review and approval. This plan shall show existing and proposed landscaping. Proposed landscaping shall be installed per approved plan.
3. An easement shall be recorded to guarantee access across Lot 6 to Lot 7.
4. A new traffic impact study shall be completed to revise the existing study done for the intersection at S. 137 Circle and West Giles Road.
5. A new site development plan needs to be submitted delineating the areas inside and outside of the building for the proposed uses. The site development plan shall also show areas designated for parking with parking spaces shown on the plan.

ii. Public Hearing: Malmquist motioned to open public hearing.

Horihan seconded. Ayes: Hewitt, Krzywicki, Alexander, Circo, Andsager, Horihan, Malmquist and Gahan. Nays: None. Public hearing opened at 7:26 p.m.

Andsager motioned to close the public hearing. Horihan seconded. Ayes: Hewitt, Krzywicki, Alexander, Circo, Andsager, Horihan, Malmquist and Gahan. Nays: None.

The applicant was not present for questions and has not been heard from regarding their application in the past two weeks.

Krzywicki was confused as to what the outdoor use of the facility would be and the draft of the conditional use permit does not make reference to allowing outdoor recreational uses and may therefore need to be modified from specifically mentioning indoor uses. Also, the hours of operation were a possible concern depending upon what was going to be done outside. Outside activities up to midnight on the week-end could be a noise problem, even though there is a buffer. Parking too is a concern as staff has already pointed out. Krzywicki felt that newer developed areas seem to have more of an issue with parking problems lately and suggests caution when making parking recommendations.

Circo, too, had parking concerns in mind since there are two conference rooms inside in addition to the recreational uses. Baker said parking was an issue mentioned to the applicant and a revised plan has not been submitted to the city.

Malmquist felt that staffs comments alone warranted continuation of the hearing and that the hearing should be re-opened this evening in order for a continuation to be made possible.

iii. Gahan motioned to re-open public hearing. Horihan seconded. Ayes: Hewitt, Krzywicki, Alexander, Circo, Andsager, Horihan, Malmquist and Gahan. Nays: None. Public hearing re-opened at 7:31 p.m.

iv. Hewitt motioned to continue the public hearing on this conditional use permit until there is a response from the applicant addressing the staffing issues. Malmquist seconded. Ayes: Hewitt, Krzywicki, Alexander, Circo, Andsager, Horihan, Malmquist and Gahan. Nays: None.

C. Southwind Expansion – Rezoning, Comprehensive Plan Amendment, and Preliminary PUD.

This item has been withdrawn from consideration at this time.

5. Comments from the Floor

None

6. Comments from the Planning Commission

Gahan commented on a visit to the new Culvers location on Sunday about 1 p.m. and it appeared that the employees were parking on both sides of the street which is bottle necking traffic flow. Baker commented that staff too had noticed this; however, the street they are parking on is a private street within that subdivision and the city has little authority there, but the city will look into any possibilities.

Krzywicki commented that he had been to the La Vista Convention Center a few times and the parking situation there is just crazy. He has heard people within Cabela's mention that when a convention is going on Cabela's customers cannot park close to the store. He wondered if when the new hotel is completed if that would free up parking.

Malmquist commented that she had always found parking when going to Cabela's and could not understand why someone going to the convention center would even consider parking at Cabela's.

Baker reminded the commission that the parking lot in front of Cabela's is a city lot for public parking.

Gahan asked if the proposed theatres would have parking exclusive to their patrons. Baker said that it is likely that the theatres and some retail uses will share parking on those properties.

Baker said that council had approved the following four items: code revisions involving minimum parking requirements were approved; Conditional Use Permits for Dogtopia and Omaha Gymnastics were approved; and revisions to the industrial code regarding mini-storage were approved.

Baker said they hoped to have the bus tour for the members of Planning Commission sometime in September or October. A tour date will be decided upon later.

Birch said the council had authorized the city to advertise proposals to prepare an 84th Street Redevelopment Vision Plan which was the number one goal of the city council strategic plan. The hand-out provided to the Planning Commission tonight will be used to advertise for prospective consultants. Copies will be mailed August 28th to interested firms.

The recent citizen survey results reflected many comments regarding the 84th Street appearance and vacant properties. A formal envisioning process will take place by a hired consultant. The first sheet within this ad explains what the 84th Street area is and La Vista in general with an explanation of what we are trying to achieve, the main goal being a highly interactive community. The city staff is asking for the consultant proposals in a variety of ways to include: key stake holders, community surveys, and workshops. A working group will be formed to include persons from the different city boards and commissions. It is hoped that these people will encourage participation from the community as a whole. The current official city website will also have a project page in order for citizens and interested parties to watch the process unfold.

The city has provided the consultants with a draft scope of work on what the city is trying to achieve. Also, in tonight's packets there is information on the visioning process. And, as well a Commissioners Newsletter that talks about streets as building blocks to the community and how a sense of place can be created. Both of these items should prove interesting and helpful as this project gets started. Contact Ann Birch or Marcus Baker if there are any questions regarding this 84th Street project.

Gahan shared information from an article in a national paper that the retailer, Steve and Barry's would be closing 100 of its 270 nationwide location. The ones' staying open would be those that receive high foot traffic. An assumption would be that this might be within shopping malls.

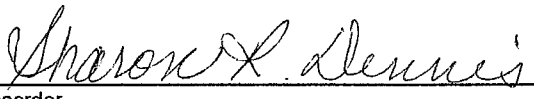
Hewitt suggested that the Planning Commission return and the city re-use the manila envelopes in which their packets are mailed to help the environment.

I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Filbrandt called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF APRIL 10, 2007 MEETING

Commissioner Birkey made a motion to approve the minutes of the April 10, 2007 Civil Service Commission meeting as presented. Seconded by Commissioner Paulhamus. Ayes: Birkey, Filbrandt, and Paulhamus. Nays: None. Absent: Kollars and Christensen. Motion carried.

Commissioner Kollars arrived to take her seat at 4:31 p.m.

III. POLICE CHIEF'S REPORT

Police Chief Lausten reported on the personnel which were hired from the last certified list for entry level officers. These personnel are still here and doing well. The city has not lost any police department personnel in the last year. John Danderand has been moved to the Criminal Investigations Bureau. Activity within the city has increased over the past year.

Our City Administrator felt that we were better staffed to handle the process internally than in previous years. The city has received a number of interest forms and we are estimating a possible 60+ applicants. Commissioner Kollars asked what methods we use to get the word out about the openings and testing. Chief Lausten stated that Career links and various free police websites are used.

Police Chief Lausten gave an overview of the timetable for testing. Chief Lausten stated that our testing process would begin with the physical agility testing before the written testing and we would give applicants two chances to pass the physical agility test. Lausten explained the agility test to the commission. The written testing would then be given in the afternoon to those that passed the agility test. Lausten stated that the personal history packet will be given to the applicant at the time they pick up an application and will need to be returned with the application.

Chief Lausten stated that the promotional testing process for the Sergeants will be completed with appointments on November 4, 2008. Would like to do physical testing for Sergeants although it was waived for the 2005 police sergeant test.

There were no comments from the floor.

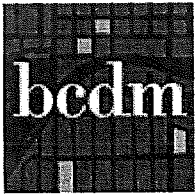

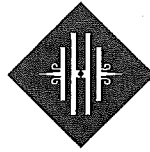

SYNOPSIS

An ordinance has been prepared to provide qualification standards for Keno Lottery Sales Outlet Locations.

FISCAL IMPACT

RECOMMENDATION

Approval.

BACKGROUND

On August 5, 2008 Council approved an agreement with La Vista Keno, Inc. for the continued operation of the city's keno lottery until the year 2018. As part of that agreement La Vista Keno will establish a satellite location as named in the contract in which to run the city's lottery game.

Prior to presenting a location site to the City or negotiating a contract with a Satellite location, the city would need to pass an ordinance establishing qualification standards which shall be met by La Vista Keno, Inc. to have its location qualify as an authorized sales outlet location for conducting a lottery. (Neb. Rev. Stat. §9-642.01)

If the Council approves these qualification standards, La Vista Keno, Inc. may begin the process to present the location site to the City and negotiate a contract with the satellite location licensed by the State.

ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE QUALIFICATION STANDARDS FOR KENO LOTTERY SALES OUTLET LOCATIONS; TO PROVIDE FOR SEVERABILITY; AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. The operator with whom the City contracts to conduct its keno lottery shall not operate the lottery at a sales outlet location other than the main location of the lottery operator without prior approval of the sales outlet location by the Mayor and City Council. The Mayor and City Council shall approve or disapprove each sales outlet location and individual, sole proprietorship, partnership, limited liability company, or corporation which desires to conduct the lottery at its sales outlet location solely on the basis of the qualification standards prescribed below. Operator shall provide or cause the owner or operator of any proposed sales outlet location to provide all information that the City requires to assess whether or not said qualification standards are satisfied. Requirements set forth herein shall equally apply to any satellite location, and references herein to "sales outlet location" shall be deemed to include any satellite location.

Section 2. Any individual, sole proprietorship, partnership, limited liability company, or corporation which seeks to have its location approved as an authorized sales outlet location shall:

(A) Obtain a retail liquor license for consumption on the premises pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. Chapter 53, article 1; and all other licenses, permits and rights required for activities conducted on the premises;

(B) Not have charges pending, been convicted of, forfeited bond upon a charge of, or pleaded guilty or nolo contendere to any offense or crime, whether a felony or a misdemeanor, involving any gambling activity, fraud, theft, willful failure to make required payments or reports, or filing false reports with a governmental agency at any level, or any other offense that, in the opinion of the City, would adversely reflect upon the City or its keno lottery;

(C) Not have charges pending, been convicted of, forfeited bond upon a charge of, or pleaded guilty or nolo contendere to any felony other than those described in Section (2)(B) within the 10 years preceding the filing of the application;

(D) Not have had a gaming license revoked or canceled, including any license under the Nebraska Bingo Act, the Nebraska County and City Lottery Act, the Nebraska Lottery and Raffle Act, or the Nebraska Pickle Card Lottery Act;

(E) Be fit, willing, and able and have sufficient facilities and resources to properly and effectively provide the service proposed in conformance with all provisions and requirements of applicable laws, rules and regulations, including the Nebraska County and City Lottery Act ("Act"), and rules and regulations adopted and promulgated pursuant to the Act, the Lottery Operator Agreement between the City of La Vista and operator, and this Ordinance (collectively as now or hereafter adopted, executed or amended "Keno Requirements"); and, if selected as a sales outlet location, provide said service in conformance with said Keno Requirements.

(F) Demonstrate that the sales outlet location serves the interests of promoting the keno game in a desirable manner to the satisfaction of the Mayor and City Council;

(G) Submit to the City a written agreement governing the proposed sales outlet location and operation thereof in form and content satisfactory to the City, which agreement shall be subject to the Lottery Operator Agreement. The Keno Requirements shall be deemed incorporated into said agreement as a condition of approval of any sales outlet location. The owner of a sales outlet location shall provide the City a copy of the fully executed agreement as a condition of the City's approval of the sales outlet location.

(H) Not have any other gambling devices located on the premises of the sales outlet location, unless authorized by the City.

(I) Not have any conflicting, competing or other interest prohibited of the operator under the Lottery Operator Agreement.

Section 3. If the person seeking to have its location approved as an authorized sales outlet location is a partnership, limited liability company, or corporation, the qualification standards shall apply to every partner of such partnership, every member of such limited liability company, every officer of such corporation and every stockholder owning more than 10% of the stock of such corporation.

Section 4. City reserves the right to amend or modify qualification standards, or adopt additional standards, at any time. Compliance with qualification standards shall be a condition of initial and ongoing approval of each sales outlet location.

Section 5. A copy of this Ordinance shall be filed with the Department of Revenue within 30 days of its adoption or amendment. The municipality shall notify the Department of Revenue of approved lottery locations within 30 days of approval. Sales outlet locations shall provide information from time to time requested by the City.

Section 6. Severability Clause. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The Mayor and City Council hereby declare that they would have passed this Ordinance and each section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared unconstitutional or invalid.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

SYNOPSIS

A resolution has been prepared and the compensation ordinance amended to reflect the following items established as part of the FY09 municipal budget:

- A 3 percent Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) in the hourly wage rate for non-exempt full-time City employees not covered by collective bargaining agreements.
- A 3 percent COLA in the monthly salary compensation rate for salaried exempt full-time City employees.
- A 3 percent COLA in the monthly salary compensation rate for management exempt employees.
- A 3 percent COLA in the hourly wage rate for non-exempt full-time Public Works employees covered by the Memorandum of Understanding adopted on September 18, 2007.
- A 5 ¼ percent increase in the hourly wage rate for police officers covered by the Amended Agreement between the La Vista Fraternal Order of Police Lodge No. 28 and the City of La Vista executed on November 27, 2007.
- A 7 ¼ percent increase in the hourly wage rate for police sergeants covered by the Amended Agreement between the La Vista Fraternal Order of Police Lodge No. 28 and the City of La Vista executed on November 27, 2007.
- Addition of the following new positions: Part Time Accountant.
- Such auto allowances and mobile phone allowances as established in the budget.

FISCAL IMPACT

The FY 08/09 municipal budget provides funding for the proposed amendments.

RECOMMENDATION

Approval and waiver of readings.

BACKGROUND

Each year as the budget is prepared the Consumer Price Index (CPI) is considered when making a recommendation regarding wage rates. The CPI for the Midwest Urban region, all items, was 4%. A 3% COLA was recommended for all employee groups not covered by collective bargaining agreements.

FY09 is the second year of a three year agreement with the Public Works Department and the final year of a two year agreement with the Fraternal Order of Police.

Based on previous discussion, the amended compensation ordinance does not include an increase for the Mayor and City Council even though funding was included in the budget. Staff is preparing an implementation plan for all of the recommendations in the compensation study, which will be presented to Council on November 18, 2008. Council will have an opportunity at that time to determine whether they want to establish a date in FY09 to enact increases for the Mayor and Council.

AN ORDINANCE TO FIX THE COMPENSATION OF OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA; TO PROVIDE FOR THE REPEAL OF ALL PRIOR ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HERewith; ORDERING THE PUBLICATION OF THE ORDINANCE IN PAMPHLET FORM; AND TO PROVIDE THE EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. City Council. The compensation of members of the City Council shall, in addition to such vehicle and other allowances as may from time to time be fixed by the Budget or other Resolution of the City Council, be, and the same hereby is, fixed at the sum of \$4,320.00 per year for each of the members of the City Council.

Section 2. Mayor. The compensation of the Mayor shall, in addition to such vehicle and other allowances as may from time to time be fixed by the Budget or other Resolution of the City Council, be, and the same hereby is, fixed at the sum of \$10,800.00 per year.

Section 3. City Administrator. The compensation of the City Administrator shall, in addition to such vehicle and other allowances as may from time to time be fixed by the Budget or other Resolution of the City Council, be established by contractual agreement.

Section 4. Management Exempt Employees. The management exempt employees of the City of La Vista, Nebraska, hereafter named, and collectively referred to as department head level employees, shall, in addition to such vehicle and other allowances as may from time to time be fixed by Resolution of the City Council, receive annualized salaries not to exceed the amounts established in Table A, set forth in Section 21 of this Ordinance, for the following respective wage ranges:

Section 8. Certification Incentive Pay for Chief Building Official and Building Inspectors.

Employees of the City in the positions of Chief Building Official and Building Inspector are eligible to receive a one time only incentive payment of \$1,000 for each certification obtained in an applicable construction field/trade. Such payment must be approved by the City Administrator.

Section 9. Legal Counsel. Compensation of the legal counsel other than special City Prosecutor for the City shall be, and the per diem rates respecting same shall be, at 90% of the standard hourly rate the firm may from time to time charge. Compensation for Special City prosecution shall be as agreed upon at the time of specific employment.

Section 10. Engineers. Compensation of Engineers for the City shall be, and the same hereby is, fixed in accordance with such schedules of hourly and per diem or percentage rates as shall from time to time be approved by Resolution of the City Council. Travel allowances respecting same shall be as may from time to time be fixed by Resolution of such City Council.

Section 11. Longevity Pay for Salaried Full-Time Employees and Hourly Paid Full-Time Employees, Including Police Employees. Employees of the City in the positions set forth in Sections 3, 5 and 6 of this Ordinance, including police positions, shall receive longevity pay as follows:

An amount equal to the following percentage of the hourly rate set forth in Section 3, 5 and 6 of this Ordinance, rounded to the nearest whole cent:

Section 12. Health, Dental Life and Long Term Disability Insurance. Subject to the terms, conditions and eligibility requirements of the applicable insurance plan documents and policies, regular full-time employees of the City of La Vista and their families shall be entitled to be enrolled in the group life, health, and dental insurance program maintained by the City. Regular full-time employees shall also be entitled to be enrolled in the long term disability insurance program maintained by the City.

Unless otherwise provided by collective bargaining agreement, or other applicable agreement, the City's employer share shall be ninety (90) percent of the amount of the actual premium and the employee shall pay the ten percent (10%) balance of the actual premium via payroll deduction for employees enrolled in single coverage. The City's employer share shall be eighty percent (80%) of the amount of the actual premium and the employee shall pay the twenty percent (20%) balance of the actual premium via payroll deduction for any employee enrolled in a level of coverage other than single. Those employees electing not to participate in these programs will receive no other form of compensation in lieu of this benefit.

Section 13. Establishment of Shifts. The City may establish duty shifts of such length, and to have such beginning and ending times, and to have such meal and break times, as it may deem appropriate or necessary, respecting employees of the City.

Section 14. Special Provisions.

- A. Employees covered by the "Agreement Between the La Vista Fraternal Order of Police Lodge No. 28 and the City of La Vista, Nebraska, Covering The Period From October 1, 2007 through September 30, 2009," shall receive compensation and benefits and enjoy working conditions, as described, provided and limited by such Agreement. The terms of such Agreement shall supersede any provisions of this Ordinance inconsistent therewith, and be deemed incorporated herein by this reference.
- B. Holiday Pay shall be compensated as set forth in the Agreement between the La Vista Fraternal Order of Police Lodge No. 28 and the City of La Vista for police officers and as set forth in the Personnel Manual for all other full time employees.
- C. Subject to subsection 14.D. hereof, each regular full-time salaried non-exempt employee and each full time hourly paid employee of the City shall be entitled to receive overtime pay at the rate of one and one half times the employee's regular rate for each hour worked in excess of forty hours during a work week. If called out at any time other than during regular assigned work hours during the pay period, such employee shall be entitled to compensation at the rate of one and one half times the regular rate for each hour so worked, provided that in no case shall an employee receive less than two hours over time pay for such call out work, and further provided there shall be no pyramiding of hours for purposes of computing overtime. For purposes of this subsection an employee's "regular rate" shall be the sum of his or her hourly rate specified in Section 5 or 6 of this Ordinance and any longevity pay due under this Ordinance.
- D. Police Department employees covered by the "Agreement Between the La Vista Fraternal Order of Police Lodge No. 28 and the City of La Vista, Nebraska," described in subsection 14.A hereof shall, as provided in such Agreement, be paid overtime at one and one half times the employee's hourly rate (including any longevity allowance) for each hour worked in excess of 80 hours during any 14 day work period coinciding with the pay period established by Section 16 of this Ordinance.
- E. All Management Exempt Employees and all Salaried Exempt Employees are considered to be salaried employees and shall not be eligible for overtime pay, holiday pay, or other special pay as provided by this section.
- F. Employees covered by the "Memorandum of Understanding" with the Public Works Employees Collective Bargaining Group may submit to the City for reimbursement for the cost of work boots in an amount not to exceed \$120.
- G. Employees covered by the "Memorandum of Understanding" with the Public Works Employees Collective Bargaining Group may submit to the City for reimbursement for the difference in cost between a Nebraska Driver's License and a "CDL" driver's license within 30 days of obtaining a CDL license when a CDL license is required as a part of the covered employee's job description.

- H. Employees covered by the "Memorandum of Understanding" with the Public Works Employees Collective Bargaining Group shall be provided by the City five safety work shirts in each fiscal year at no cost to the employee.

Section 15. Pay for Unused Sick Leave Upon Retirement or Death. Employees who voluntarily retire after twenty or more years of service with the City and have no pending disciplinary action at the time of their retirement, shall be paid for any unused sick leave. Employees who began their employment with the City after January 1, 2005, or who began their employment prior to this date but elected to waive their eligibility for emergency sick leave, shall be paid for any unused sick leave, if they voluntarily leave City employment and have no pending disciplinary action, according to the following sliding schedule: After 10 years of employment – 100% of sick leave hours accrued over 660 and up to 880; after 15 years of employment – 100% of sick leave hours accrued over 440 hours and up to 880; after 20 years of employment – 100% of sick leave hours accrued up to 880. No other employee shall be paid for any unused sick leave upon termination of employment.

A regular full-time employee's unused sick leave shall also be paid if, after October 1, 1999, the employee sustains an injury which is compensable by the City or the City's insurer under the Nebraska Workers' Compensation Act and such injury causes the death of the employee within two years after the date of injury. Any payment made pursuant to the preceding sentence shall be made to the surviving spouse of the employee; provided, such payment shall be made to the employee's estate if the employee leaves no surviving spouse or if, prior to his or her death, the employee filed with the City Clerk a written designation of his or her estate as beneficiary of such payment.

Section 16. Pay Periods. All employees of the City of La Vista shall be paid on a bi-weekly basis. The pay period will commence at 12:01 a.m. Sunday and will conclude at 11:59 p.m. on the second succeeding Saturday, except for Police Officers, in which case the pay period will commence at 11:00 p.m. Saturday and will conclude at 10:59 p.m. on the second succeeding Sunday. On the Friday following the conclusion of the pay period, all employees shall be paid for all compensated time that they have been accredited with during the pay period just concluded.

Section 17. Public Works Lunch and Clean-up Times. Lunch period for employees of the Public Works Department shall be one half hour (30 minutes) in duration. Public Works employees shall be granted a 5 minute clean-up period prior to start of lunch period, and shall be granted an additional 5 minutes clean-up period prior to the end of the work day.

Section 18. Sick Leave and Personal Leave. Sick leave and personal leave will be awarded and administered in conjunction with the provisions set forth in the personnel manual and the Agreement between the La Vista Fraternal Order of Police Lodge No. 28 and the City of La Vista, as applicable to the employee in question.

Section 19. Vacation Leave. Upon satisfactory completion of the probationary period applicable to the employee in question, regular full-time employees and permanent part-time employees shall be entitled to vacation leave. Such vacation shall not be used in installments of less than two hours. Increments of vacation leave of less than four hours must have 48 hours prior approval and can be taken only at the beginning or at the end of the work day.

Section 20. Vacation Entitlement.

- A. All full-time employees whose employment is governed by the Agreement described in Section 14, Paragraph A. of this Ordinance shall earn and be eligible for vacation as provided in such Agreement.
- B. All other full-time Hourly Non-Exempt Employees shall earn: six (6) days of paid vacation upon completion of one (1) year of continuous full-time employment; eleven (11) days of paid vacation upon completion of two (2) years of continuous full-time employment; and thereafter, eleven (11) days of paid vacation upon completion of each subsequent year of continuous full-time employment, plus one (1) additional day of paid vacation for each year of continuous full-time employment in excess of two years. Notwithstanding the foregoing, no employee shall earn more than twenty-three (23) days of paid vacation per employment year.
- C. All Management Exempt Employees, and Salaried Exempt Employees, shall earn ten (10) days paid vacation after one (1) year of continuous employment, and one (1) additional vacation day for each additional year of continuous employment not to exceed twenty-six (26) days.
- D. All Permanent Part Time Employees working a minimum of twenty (20) hours per week shall earn forty (40) hours of paid vacation time per year after six (6) months of employment and

successful completion of the initial or extended initial probationary period. Total paid vacation time earned per year shall not exceed forty (40) hours.

- E. Exempt, Non-Exempt, and Permanent Part-Time Employees shall be allowed to accrue unused vacation leave from previous years to a maximum of 220 hours.

SYNOPSIS

A resolution has been prepared awarding a contract to Dostals Construction Company, Inc., Gretna, Nebraska for the construction of (8) eight cart corrals for Off Street Parking District I, in an amount not to exceed \$83,000.00.

FISCAL IMPACT

They FY 08/09 Off Street Parking District Fund Budget provides \$81,000.00 for the proposed purchase. Savings in other line items in the Off Street Parking District I Fund will be necessary to cover the \$2,000.00 overage.

RECOMMENDATION

BACKGROUND

The city parking lot currently has ten (10) cart corrals. The original engineer estimate for each corral was \$8,100.00. The rapid increases in steel prices however, required the bid document to be modified and request only (8) eight cart corrals. On August 19, 2008 council approved the advertisement for bids for construction of said cart corrals. Bids were opened and read aloud on September 9, 2008 at the offices of BCDM. Dostals Construction Company Inc. was the only company to submit a bid. The original contract documents required the project to be completed in 90 days from September 17, 2008. Dostals bid for this timeline was \$94,500.00. Dostals submitted an alternate bid with a November 1, 2008 start date and 90 day completion timeline for \$83,000.00. It is recommended that Council approve the alternate bid. An alternate bid price for the purchase of additional cart corrals was requested. Dostals bid for additional corrals was \$9,800.00 each. Design Architect Kevin Schluckebier recommends Dostals Construction Company Inc., as the low compliant bidder.

On June 3, 2008 the City Council adopted the strategic plan that was developed during the annual strategic planning work session held by the Mayor and City Council on March 8, 2008. This is the first quarterly progress report since the adoption of the plan.

BACKGROUND

On Saturday, March 8, 2008 the Mayor and City Council held their annual strategic planning work session. As a result, the collaborative effort with the management team produced the City's Strategic Plan for 2008-2010 which Council approved via Resolution No. 08-054 on June 3, 2008.



City of La Vista, Nebraska Strategic Plan for 2008-2010

As a part of the annual strategic planning work session the Mayor and City Council developed and has adopted this strategic plan to position the city government to meet La Vista's future needs.

1. Pursue revitalization of the 84th Street corridor

Key objectives:

- a. Educate the community that revitalization of the 84th Street corridor is twofold which includes dealing with the loss of businesses and vacant storefronts as well as potential redevelopment of the corridor

Responsible Parties: Administration

Action Steps:

- Utilize press releases, quarterly *CityWise* newsletter, website to inform the public about issues and progress related to 84th Street.

Timeline: Immediate & ongoing

- b. Seek professional services to bring new ideas to the table and offer advice on next steps in plan development

Responsible Parties: Administration & Community Development

Action Steps:

- Identify and secure funding for project
- Develop project scope & proposed timeline
- Prepare RFQ/RFP documents
- Select consultants

Timeline: Begin process immediately in anticipation of having consultant on board in Fall 2008

Update: In July 2008, Council obligated CDBG Recovered Program Income Reuse Funds to a planning/engineering study for the 84th Street corridor. In August 2008 Council authorized a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the preparation of an 84th Street Redevelopment Vision Plan. It is anticipated that a contract will be awarded in December 2008 and the project will kick-off in early 2009.

- c. Engage stakeholders in exploring options and contributing to a long-term vision for the corridor

Responsible Parties: Mayor, Council, Administration & Community Development

Action Steps:

- Consider appointing an 84th Street Vision Steering Committee
- Identify stakeholders & encourage active participation in the visioning process
- Identify community resources
- Pursue discussions with the cities of Papillion and Ralston about inter-local cooperation in corridor redevelopment.

Timeline: Fall 2008 & ongoing

Update: Once a consultant has been selected to provide professional services associated with the 84th Street Redevelopment Vision Plan an advisory committee and key stakeholders will be identified and included in the process. Plans are also in the works to coordinate with neighboring jurisdictions.

d. Seek consensus on a long-term corridor vision that includes a "city centre"

Action Steps:

- "City Centre" concept being considered as a part of the municipal facilities plan currently underway.
- Stay abreast of potential opportunities to facilitate the "City Centre" concept

Timeline: Ongoing

e. Consider public improvements that could stimulate private development of the corridor

Action Steps:

- Work with NE Department of Roads on the transition of 84th Street from a State Highway to local arterial
- Coordinate with neighboring cities

Timeline: Immediate

f. Rigorously pursue actions to encourage property owners with vacant space, especially owner of former Wal-Mart property, to lease or sell their property to viable businesses

Responsible Parties: Mayor, Administration, Community Development

Action Steps:

- ICSC Meeting with Kroenke representative
- Provide additional information to Kroenke as requested
- Coordinate meeting with property decision maker(s)
- Develop inventory of vacant commercial/retail properties and provide direct links to site that lists properties available for development

Update: The Mayor and staff met with a Kroenke representative at ICSC and continue to maintain contact and provide information. Staff has provided the company with information regarding the National Citizen Survey and the 84th Street Visioning project and continues to try to set up a meeting with the company's decision maker(s).

2. Provide for planned, fiscally responsible expansion of the city's boundaries.

- a. Adopt a long-range plan for the annexation of both residential and industrial subdivisions

Responsible Parties: All departments will be involved with primary responsibility to Community Development, Finance & Administration

Action Steps:

- Community Development and Finance prepare detailed plan based on discussion from the 2008 Annual Strategic Planning workshop.
- Draft to Council by 2009 Strategic Planning Workshop

Timeline: Plan adoption Spring 2009

Update: Staff is currently working on this.

- b. Plan for infrastructure improvements necessitated by growth in the city's capital improvement budget

Timeline: Ongoing

- c. Communicate the annexation plan and property tax implications to residents and businesses located in new growth areas

Timeline: TBD based on plan.

3. Maintain the quality of older residential neighborhoods

Key objectives:

- a. Provide for essential maintenance and priority improvements in neighborhood public facilities through the city's capital improvement plan

Responsible Parties: Public Works

Action Steps:

- Submit public facility improvements as part of the CIP process.

Timeline: Ongoing

- b. Ensure attractive neighborhoods by strengthening and enforcing city building and environmental codes

Responsible Parties: Community Development

Action Steps:

- Review and propose improvements to municipal codes.
- Continue to be proactive in code enforcement.

Timeline: Ongoing

- c. Contribute to the safety and attractiveness of rental housing through the implementation of a rental inspection program

Responsible Parties: Community Development

Action Steps:

- Develop proposal for rental housing program.
- Recommend program as part of the FY 08/09 budget

Timeline: Summer 2008

Update: Funding for a rental housing program was requested and approved in the FY 08/09 municipal budget. Staff is currently working on the development of a program to propose to Council later this fall in anticipation of kicking it off in early 2009.

Timeline: Committee established by Summer of 2008; La Vista story completed in 2010.

Update: Oral histories are currently in the process of being recorded. Once these have been completed the focus will turn to the collection of memorabilia.

A 50th Anniversary Celebration planning committee has recently been formed and has started to meet regularly. We tried to ensure that all segments of the community are represented on the committee. This planning effort is currently in the initial stages and it is intended that Council be kept informed as progress occurs.

- b. Develop and aggressively market a La Vista community identity through strategic partnerships with the Chamber of Commerce and the Community Foundation

Responsible Parties: Administration

Action Steps:

- Provide funding for community marketing materials
- Complete "The Economic Report" documentary & provide for distribution in DVD format
- Identify opportunities for cooperative efforts with Chamber and Foundation

Timeline: Immediate & Ongoing.

Update: Filming for the Economic Report segment was completed in July. We are currently in the final production phase and anticipate completion in the next couple of weeks. Airings generally take several months to complete.
