- For one price – you, your spouse, and children can check out:
 - Books! New books arrive at the library every month. We’ve just added comic books to our collection. The library also serves the Metropolitan Community College’s Sarpy County Center, so we have educational materials for you to use as well. Audio books – on both CD and cassette – for those long trips or to pass time in traffic – are available.
 - Our collection of Music CDs is expanding.
 - We have Videos – both educational and entertaining.
 - Our Movie DVD collection continues to grow.
 - We even have magazines you can check out.
- Did you know that what you would pay for two hardback books (\$25.00 each) will get you one year’s access to La Vista Public Library’s entire collection? How much have you spent on movie rentals the past year?
- Even if the library doesn’t own a specific book, as a library user for \$2.00, the library will get the book from another library for your use.

- The \$50.00 membership includes access to the library reference room. The reference desk is your one-stop shopping for those questions you need answered. Need an address or a zip code? Wondering what internet sites offer reliable medical information? Call, e-mail, or stop by.
- Did we mention our computer lab? The La Vista Public Library has a computer lab complete with a typewriter and a network scanner. Library patrons are eligible to sign up for computer classes – at no charge. Also, the internet does not cost you anything at our library. Surf the web and sign up for a free e-mail account. The library staff can help you learn how.
- The library has educational computer games that children can access while they are at the library. These games help children become familiar with a computer and have fun while they are doing it. Stop by to see our collection.
- Story times are available for toddlers and preschoolers. These sessions are geared to help your children get used to a group setting, taking turns, and enjoying reading.
- Special programming available to you: Our Summer Reading Program is expanding to include teens, thanks to an addition to the Library staff who is dedicated to teens and their needs; in the past year, a new book club has been started that focuses on family history and adult programming; the Library has authors who come and talk about their books; and the Library offers seasonal activities for children.
